
## **CHAPTER BYLAWS**

# **PSE OF CASTLE ROCK**



Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948

To carry out and assist on a local basis the objectives and purposes of the Public School 16 Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948. 17 18 B. To promote the organization of Public School Employees in the Castle Rock School District. 19 20 C. To promote the welfare of the membership and the classified employees of the Castle Rock 21 School District, and to provide a voice in the determination of the terms and conditions of 22 employment. We are committed to the process of collective bargaining as a desirable, 23 democratic and effective method to achieve this. 24 25 D. To promote and provide systematic and effective employee management through collective 26 bargaining; to confer and negotiate in good faith, with respect to grievance procedures and 27 collective negotiations on personnel matters, including wages, hours and working conditions, 28 vacations, holidays and other conditions of employment for the classified employees of Castle 29 Rock School District. 30 31 E. Both as members and as citizens, we shall also employ available legislative and political action 32 to establish adequate financial provisions for the improvement of public school education and 33 equitable consideration for the classified school employees from the State Legislators. 34 35 To establish better fellowship and understanding among classified school employees 36 and to strive for their overall betterment through training, legislation and Association benefits. 37 38 39 40 **ARTICLE V** 41 42 **MEMBERSHIP** 43 44 45

Section 1.1. Eligibility.

Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, any person without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, sex or political belief, who meets the requirements hereinafter listed shall be eligible for membership.

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## **Section 1.2. Active Member.**

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- A. All persons regularly employed as a classified school employee (as defined by the Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948) by or for Castle Rock Public Schools, and who are members of the Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948, are eligible for membership in the organization.
- B. Active members who are paying dues through a system of regular payroll deduction shall, for as long as they continue to pay through such payroll deduction, be considered to be in good standing.

### **Section 1.3. Member in Good Standing.**

To be eligible to vote and to hold office, a member must be in good standing. To be in good standing, the member shall be employed, and current in payment of dues as are required by these bylaws. Any member, who is on authorized leave of absence pursuant to the Collective Bargaining Agreement, shall retain the right to vote and hold office. Any member who is terminated from employment shall not be eligible to vote or hold office.

## Section 1.4. Free-Riders.

Any member who opts out of payment of regular dues, shall be characterized as a free-rider and shall be entitled only to those rights and privileges as set forth in the PSE policy and bylaws. Free-riders shall not be entitled to hold any local or state office, attend local or state meetings, vote for local or state leaders or vote for ratification of collective bargaining agreements. In addition, free-riders may not attend any PSE sponsored functions. Free-riders are not eligible to appeal a grievance which is not validated by the local chapter to the State Grievance Panel.

### Section 2. Dues.

- A. Application for membership shall be made on a standard form provided by Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948. This form is also a valid authorization for payroll deduction of dues.
- B. Local membership dues of this organization shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per year.
- C. Local membership dues shall be paid each October by payroll deduction and will be submitted to the Secretary-Treasurer of Public School Employees of Castle Rock.
- D. Membership dues are not refundable except where an error resulting in an overpayment exists.

#### Section 3. Rights.

- A. Members shall suffer no impairment of freedom of speech concerning the operations of this organization. Active discussions of organization affairs shall be encouraged and protected within this organization.
- B. Members in good standing shall have the right to fair and democratic elections at all levels of the organization. This includes due notice of nominations and elections, equal opportunities for competing candidates, and proper election procedures which shall be specifically set forth.

- C. Members in good standing shall have an equal right to run and hold office, except those employees classified either by State statute or appropriate State regulatory agencies as being a "supervisory employee".
- D. Members in good standing shall have the right to a full and clear accounting of all organizational funds. At all levels such accounting shall include, but not be limited to, periodical reports to the membership by appropriate fiscal officers or by independent auditors not otherwise connected with the organization, and a financial audit at least once a year which is made available to all members.
- E. Members in good standing shall have the right to full participation, through discussion and vote, in the decision making processes of the organization and to pertinent information needed for the exercises of this right.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### **MEETINGS**

## Section 1.

General membership meetings of this organization shall be held at least three (3) times annually at a time and place to be fixed by the membership or the Board of Trustees. Free-riders are not permitted to attend general membership meetings.

#### Section 2.

Special meetings may be called by the President, the Board of Trustees, or by petition filed with the President and signed by twenty percent (20%) of the members of this organization.

### Section 3.

The President shall provide at least five (5) days notification to all members of any meeting called. However, said five (5) days notice may be waived by the Board of Trustees provided that every reasonable effort is employed to notify the membership of the meeting.

#### Section 4.

At any meeting of the membership of this organization, each member in good standing present shall be entitled to one vote. A member must be present to vote - no proxy vote will be allowed. A minimum of ten (10) members must be present to constitute a quorum before any organization business may be transacted.

#### **ARTICLE VII**

### **MANAGEMENT**

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## Section 1.

The business and property of this organization shall be managed by a Board of Trustees, except when the meetings of the organization are in session. All matters affecting the purposes, aims and means of accomplishing the purposes of this organization, not specifically provided for in these Bylaws or by action of the members at a regular or special meeting shall be decided by the Board of Trustees.

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## Section 2.

The Board of Trustees shall be composed of the President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer and a unit representative elected by the unit from each of the following classifications of employees of the school district if represented by the local Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948 organization.

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- Classifications:
- 1. Food Service
- 2. Custodial
- 3. Maintenance
- 4. Paraeducators and Health Care
- 5. Bus Drivers and Mechanics
- 6. Secretaries
- 7. Other units requesting further affiliation.

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## Section 3.

The term of office of the trustees of this organization shall be for a period of one (1) year or until their successors are elected.

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## Section 4.

The Board of Trustees shall hold meetings as the President or the Board shall deem necessary for the competent management of affairs of the organization.

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## Section 5.

Each member of the Board of Trustees shall possess one (1) vote in matters coming before the Board. All voting at meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be by each member present in person, and voting by proxy shall not be allowed. A majority of four (4) members of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum.

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#### Section 6.

Chapter Bylaws

PSE of Castle Rock

Any trustee or officer may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the membership at any regular or special meeting of the membership of the organization. Notice of the proposed removal of the trustee or officer must be given to the trustee five (5) days prior to the date of the meeting at which the removal is to be voted upon. Such notice to the trustee or officer must state the cause for the proposed removal. Each written notice must contain a clear statement of the specific charges against the respondent. Grounds for removal shall be serious misconduct, such as criminal acts, advancement of the interests of another union or organization to the detriment of PSE, willful refusal to perform the duties of office, or gross incompetence. Mere disagreement with the policies or positions of the respondent shall not be grounds for recall.

#### Section 7.

Unexcused absences from two (2) consecutive meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be due cause for removal of the trustee by the Board of Trustees. Removal of a Board member because of excessive absenteeism shall not require the 2/3 vote of membership.

## Section 8.

Any vacancies occurring on the Board of Trustees by reason of death, resignation or removal shall be filled by the remaining trustees. In the event that such trustee is an officer, such selection shall be from the membership at large. All other trustees' vacancies shall be filled from the classification of which they are representatives. Such appointee shall serve during the unexpired term of the trustee whose position has become vacant.

## 1213 Section 9.

In order to encourage participation in board and general union meetings, the following reimbursement of union dues shall be made out of the union general fund.

The Executive Board, consisting of the president, vice president and secretary-treasurer, will be reimbursed one hundred dollars (\$100) of their union dues for attending board and general membership meetings. The trustees will be reimbursed fifty dollars (\$50) of their union dues for attending board and general membership meetings. Reimbursements will be made annually in June.

If Executive Board members and trustees attend less than 50% of all executive and general membership meetings, they will forfeit their payment. Attendance can be by remoting in or in person. Co-positions will share the reimbursement.

This shall take effect after the yearly officer/trustee elections in May 2021 and will be re-evaluated annually. The first reimbursement to be made in June 2022.

#### **ARTICLE VIII**

### OFFICERS, NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

## Section 1.

The officers of this organization shall be a President, a Vice President, and a Secretary-Treasurer. All officers shall be elected for a term of one year.

## Section 2.

Nominations may be made by the nominating committee, but whether or not such nominating committee is used, nominations shall be permitted from the floor at the meeting held to elect officers.

#### Section 3.

To be eligible for office, a member must be in good standing for one year immediately preceding the election, except in the initial election held in this organization, and must qualify under the provisions of Article V, Section 3-C.

#### Section 4.

Officers shall be elected by secret ballot vote, and the balloting shall be so conducted as to afford all members a reasonable opportunity to vote. At least ten (10) days advance notice shall be given the membership prior to the holding of the election.

#### Section 5.

Every officer and trustee shall, upon assuming office, subscribe to the obligation of an officer and trustee, contained in these Bylaws. There shall be one (1) trustee from each classification.

## Section 6.

In the event of a prolonged natural disaster, pandemic, or other "Act of God" which prevents the membership from meeting in person for the purposes of voting for union officers through secret ballot for an extended period of time, the following process for appointment of interim local union officers to fill positions shall be utilized:

1) If an election cannot be held prior to the conclusion of the current school year, all officers who are currently in office and wish to continue to serve shall be considered "interim" officers until such time as an election can be safely held, which time shall not exceed six months;

2) In the event that the President wishes to step down from the presidency, and or is no longer eligible to serve as President, the Vice-President shall serve as the interim President until such time as a secret ballot election can occur, which time shall not exceed six months;

3) In the event that any officer or Board Member (other than the President) no longer wishes to serve or is no longer eligible to serve, the Executive Board shall appoint a willing member to serve as the interim officer until such time as a secret ballot election can occur, which time shall not exceed six months.

## **ARTICLE IX**

**DUTIES OF OFFICERS** 

## Section 1. President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Trustees. The President shall supervise all activities of the organization; execute all instruments in its behalf; countersign all checks drawn against the fund of the organization; appoint all special committees of the organization subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees; report periodically to the membership regarding the progress and standing of the organization in regard to the President's official acts; perform all other duties as prescribed in the Bylaws and perform such other duties usually inherent in such office.

## Section 2. Vice President.

The Vice President shall act for the President in the President's absence and perform such other acts as the President or Board of Trustees may direct. The Vice President may be authorized, by the Board of Trustees, to act as a co-signer of checks drawn on the funds of the organization in place of or in addition to either the President or Secretary.

#### Section 3. Secretary-Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep all records of the organization, the Board of Trustees, and to perform such other acts as the President and Board of Trustees may direct. The Treasurer shall receive and be accountable for all funds and monies belonging to the organization; pay all obligations incurred by the organization in payment as authorized by the Board of Trustees; maintain bank accounts and depositories designated by the Board of Trustees; and such money shall be withdrawn only by checks signed by the President and/or Vice President and the Secretary-Treasurer; and shall render periodical financial reports as required by the Board of Trustees or by the membership; and keep an accurate record of receipts and disbursements; and shall act as custodian of all properties of the organization.

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#### FINANCIAL AFFAIRS

**ARTICLE X** 

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## Section 1. Expenses.

PSE's administrative and financial needs.

PSE shall reimburse members of the Board of Directors, employees, and members assigned to official PSE activities as approved by the board, or prescribed by these bylaws, all reasonable and necessary expenses related to carrying out the official business of PSE. Abuse of, or false claims for, expense reimbursement shall be deemed a serious act of misconduct and may be cause for removal of any board member, employee, or another person making such claim. Civil or criminal remedy may be pursued based on the circumstances of the incident(s).

Appropriate supporting evidence of expenses shall be submitted as required in advance of payment,

otherwise payment may be withheld. The board may establish an actual expense reimbursement plan

or per diem system at its discretion, depending on which system most efficiently and effectively meets

**ARTICLE XI** 

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

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#### 36 Section 1. 37

This organization shall be at all times subject to the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948.

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## Section 2.

Except to the extent specified in the Bylaws, no officer of this organization shall have the power to act as agent for, or otherwise bind this organization in any way whatsoever. No member or group of members or any other person or persons shall have the power to act on behalf of or otherwise bind the organization except to the extent specifically authorized in writing by the President or Board of Trustees of the organization.
