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A. <u>NAME</u>

The name of this Chapter shall be Public School Employees of Columbia/Burbank and shall be an affiliate of Public School Employees of Washington (PSE), a not-for-profit 501(c)5 labor organization operating under the laws of the State of Washington. This organization was chartered by Public School Employees of Washington on May 17, 1979.

19 20	Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, any person, without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, sex, or political belief, shall be eligible for Membership.			
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22	Section 1.1.1. Active Member.			
23	Any classified school employee who is regularly employed by or for the Columbia School			
24	District #400, and who is a member of Public School Employees of Washington, is eligible for			
25	Membership in this Chapter. A classified employee is one whose position does not require a			
26	teaching certificate.

28	Section 1.1.2. Member In Good Standing. To be aligible to yets and to hold office, a member must be in good standing. To be in good			
29 30	To be eligible to vote and to hold office, a member must be in good standing. To be in good standing, the member shall be employed and current in payment of dues as are required by			
31	these Bylaws. Any member, who is on authorized leave of absence pursuant to the Collective			
32	Bargaining Agreement, shall retain the right to vote and hold office. Any member who is			
33	terminated from employment shall not be eligible to vote or hold office.

36	Any member who opts out of payment of regular dues, shall be characterized as a free-rider and			
37	shall be entitled only to those rights and privileges as set forth in the PSE policy and Bylaws.			
38	Free-riders shall not be entitled to hold any local or State office, attend any local or State			
39	meetings, vote for local or State leaders or vote for ratification of Collective Bargaining			
40	Agreements. In addition, free-riders may not attend any PSE sponsored functions. Free riders			
41	are not eligible to appeal a grievance which is not validated by the local chapter to the State			
42	Grievance Panel. Or be able to apply for scholarships on the local or State levels for either the			
43	free-rider or their dependents.

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PSE field staff shall work closely with the Chapter in an advisory position. All decisions governing the business of the local Chapter shall be the sole responsibility of the elected officials and Membership of the Chapter.

10 Section 3.6. OPERATING PRINCIPLES.

In order to provide the Chapter with the highest quality direction and management possible, the following operating principles shall guide the Board of Trustees.

- 1314 Section 3.6.1. Board/Membership Relationships.
- A positive, constructive, cooperative relationship between the Board of Trustees and the Membership is essential to achieving the mission and vision of the organization. Therefore, the board and Membership will conduct themselves in a way that promotes mutual trust, demonstrates respect for individual dignity, and displays professionalism. The board shall utilize positive conflict resolution methods and maintain open, honest lines of communication

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22 Section 3.6.2. Media.

The President, or his/her designee, is the primary spokesperson for the Chapter.

Media inquiries to individual Board Members about matters of Chapter concern should be referred to the Chapter President. Inquiries about a position of PSE on any matter of Statewide concern or specific legislation should be referred to the Executive Director at State headquarters.

Chapter Oath of Office. 32 Oath to be done by all Chapter Leaders yearly after Chapter elections. 33 34 I pledge to faithfully observe the Bylaws and Constitution of both the Public School Employees 35 of Columbia-Burbank PSE Chapter as well as of PSE/SEIU 1948, and to work to the best of my 36 ability to provide effective and responsible leadership and representation to the members. 37 38 I pledge to act with integrity and not engage in conduct or performance which is contrary to 39 the good order, welfare, or legitimate interests of my chapter of PSE. Further, I pledge to 40 defend the principles of trade unionism and to work to improve the lives of working people. 41 42 I swear under oath that I will protect and defend the rights of every member of the Public 43 School Employees of Columbia-Burbank PSE Chapter and fairly represent their interests, 44 needs, and legal rights. 45 46

 by proxy shall not be allowed. A majority of the members of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a

12 13 Section 5.5.1. President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Chapter and of the Board of Trustees. The 14 President shall be made aware of and supervise all activities of the Chapter; execute all 15 instruments in its behalf; and work with PSE Field Staff, with the advice and consent of the 16 Board of Trustees, to achieve the mission, vision, goals, and objectives of the Chapter. The 17 President shall appoint all special committees not otherwise provided for in the Bylaws of the 18 Chapter, subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees, and serve as an ex-officio member of 19 all committees. The President shall report periodically to the Membership regarding the 20 progress and standing of the Chapter in regard to the President's official acts; and perform all 21 other duties of the office. Upon being elected Chapter President, the President's union dues 22 shall be reimbursed quarterly. 23

25 Section 5.5.2. Vice President.

The Vice President shall provide such assistance to the President as requested; serve as chairperson of the Grievance Committee; shall, in the absence of the President, perform duties of that office; and in the case of permanent disability or resignation of the President, shall succeed to that office for the unexpired portion of the current term of office.

31 Section 5.5.3. Secretary/Treasurer.

The Secretary/Treasurer shall ensure that the minutes of general Membership meetings and 32 Board of Trustee meetings are duly recorded. It shall be the duty of the Secretary/Treasurer to 33 keep all records of the Chapter, the Board of Trustees, and to perform such other official 34 functions as the President and Board of Trustees may direct. The Secretary/Treasurer shall 35 receive and be accountable for all funds and monies belonging to the Chapter; pay all 36 obligations incurred by the Chapter as authorized by the Board of Trustees; keep an accurate 37 record of receipts and disbursements; and maintain bank accounts and depositories designated 38 by the Board of Trustees. Such money shall be withdrawn only by checks signed by the 39 President and/or Vice President and the Secretary/Treasurer. The Secretary/Treasurer shall 40 render periodical financial reports as required by the Board of Trustees, the Membership, or 41 Public School Employees of Washington to ensure that the Chapter is in compliance with all 42 laws and regulations required by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and the Department of 43 Labor. The fiscal year for all financial reports shall be from September 1st to August 31st of the 44 following year, inclusive. The Secretary/Treasurer shall act as custodian of all properties of the 45 Chapter. The Secretary/Treasurer shall submit the 990-N report to Public School Employees of 46 Washington/SEIU by October 31st a financial report as required to maintain a non-profit status 47 with the IRS. 48

2	A Trustee shall represent the classification of employees which elected them and express to the
3	Board of Trustees the needs, desires, and concerns of the members in their classification. They
4	will be responsible, along with the Grievance Committee, in advising an employee about their

10	ELECTIONS, FILLING OF VACANCIES, AND RECALL PROCEDURES

12	Section 6.1.
13	Members shall have the right to fair and democratic elections at all levels of the Chapter. This includes
14	ten (10) working days notice of nominations and elections. Equal opportunities for competing
15	candidates to state their qualifications and reasons for seeking office to the Chapter Membership.
16 17	Elections shall be conducted by secret written ballot and certified by the Chapter Secretary/Treasurer.

20	Members shall have an equal right to run and hold office, except those persons set forth in RCW

25	Elections shall be held during the month of May. Terms of office shall be from September 1 st through
26	August 31 st or until negotiations are finished.

29	Nominations shall be from the floor at the meeting held for the election.

32	To be eligible, a member must be in good standing for one (1) year immediately preceding the election.
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34	Section 6.6.
35	Members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected by secret ballot vote, and the balloting shall be so
36	conducted as to afford all members a reasonable opportunity to vote. At least ten (10) working days
37	advance notice shall be given the Membership prior to the holding of the election.

39	Section 6.6.1.
40	All members of the Chapter shall be eligible to vote for the positions of President, Vice
41	President, and Secretary/Treasurer. In the election of a Trustee, only members in the
42	classification of employees that the Trustee will represent shall be allowed to vote.

44	Section 6.7.
45	Every member of the Board of Trustees shall, upon assuming office, subscribe to the obligations
46	contained in these Bylaws.

- Any member of the Board of Trustees may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the 2
- Membership present at any regular meeting of the Chapter. Written notice of the proposed removal 3
- must be given to the Board of Trustee member at least five (5) working days prior to the date of the 4
- meeting at which the removal is to be voted upon. Such notice must State the cause for the proposed 5 removal.

- Unexcused absences from three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be due cause 9
- for removal of the member by the Board of Trustees. Removal of a board member because of 10
- excessive absenteeism shall not require the 2/3 vote of the Membership. 11

A vacancy in any position, except that of President, shall be filled by the Board of Trustees in 14 accordance with the procedures set forth below: 15

In the event the President cannot serve the remainder of his/her current term, the Vice President 18 shall serve as President for the completion of the term. 19

Section 6.10.2.

21 In the event of a vacancy in the Office of Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer, all members 22 shall be notified of the vacancy and nominations solicited for the position. Nominations shall 23 be accepted for a period of twenty (20) calendar days following the notification to members. 24 The President, at his/her discretion, may call a meeting of the Board of Trustees, or act upon 25 the vacancy at the next regularly scheduled board meeting. Each candidate for the position 26 may submit a letter or have three (3) minutes to address the board prior to the vote to describe 27 their qualifications and reasons they are seeking the position. 28

Section 6.10.3.

Any other vacancy shall be filled only for the remainder of the term in which the vacancy 31 occurs; provided, however, that when vacancies occur in the Office of Trustee, the President 32 shall direct that a regular union meeting be held and that the classification elect a successor for 33 the remainder of the vacant term. Election of the successor must be by majority vote. 34

ARTICLE VII

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 7.1. 43

- Local Chapters shall adopt Bylaws that do not conflict with PSE State Bylaws. State Bylaws shall 44 always supersede local Bylaws where conflict exists. 45
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1 Section 7.2.

This Chapter shall send to the PSE State office a list of names and addresses of its Board of Trustees and members, together with other information required by PSE and shall notify PSE of all changes in

4 board members, members, and addresses.

5 6 Section 7.3.

This Chapter shall not enter into any Collective Bargaining Agreement, amendment thereto, dispute 7 settlement agreement, grievance settlement agreement, or any other agreement or waiver which affects 8 or pertains to wages, hours or working conditions of the employees in the bargaining unit, nor any 9 agreement which would affect the rights of employees represented by PSE, nor any agreement 10 affecting the scope of any collective bargaining unit, with the District, Employer, or other entity or 11 agent, unless such agreement is first reviewed and approved by the Executive Director of Public 12 School Employees of Washington or his/her designee, provided decisions of the Executive Director 13 may be appealed to the Board of Directors. 14

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16 Section 7.3.1.

Original signed copies of all documents pertaining to issues outlined in Section 7.3. shall be
 submitted to the regional service center, who will then forward the original to State
 headquarters after appropriate copies have been made.

21 Section 7.4. Building Representative.

A Building Representative will have the responsibility of updating the PSE board with the most current 22 information (Contracts, Bylaws, Seniority Lists, and any pertinent information etc.). If there are issues 23 that are brought to the attention of the Building Representative, they will forward the information to 24 the Vice President who will bring it to the Board of Trustees. Buildings may choose to hold a meeting 25 and select their Building Representative. This may also be done via email. The elections for this 26 position will be in May and will run from May to May. This is to be done every year although the 27 same person can be chosen/elected each year. You must be a dues paying member to hold this position. 28 Communication will be provided to the Building Reps to be distributed to the building PSE members. 29 Building Representatives (who are not on the Board of Trustees) are not authorized to serve in a union 30 representation capacity. 31

ARTICLE VIII

COMMITTEES AND DELEGATES

39 Section 8.1. Grievance Committee.

A Grievance Committee shall be composed of the President, Vice President and one (1) Classification
 Representative from a classification not already represented and shall be responsible for advising
 members of their rights as outlined in the State Bylaws, Article XIV, State Grievance Panel.

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44 <u>Section 8.2.</u> <u>Negotiating Committee.</u>

⁴⁵ A Negotiating Committee shall be Board of Trustees and a representative from each classification of

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1 Section 8.3. Annual Convention Delegates.

Delegates and alternates shall be elected by secret ballot. Delegates and alternates shall represent the 2 best interests of the Membership. Elected delegates and alternates who fail to perform their duties by 3 not showing up to Convention shall reimburse the Chapter any funds lost. Failure to reimburse the 4 Chapter will result in an ineligibility to be elected or serve as a Chapter Delegate or Alternate for a 5 period of three (3) years. Delegates with unexcused absences from any Convention meetings or 6 workshops may not be eligible to attend future conventions and may be held financially responsible for 7 reimbursing the chapter for forfeited convention expenses. Convention expenses shall be reimbursed 8 as follows: 9 10 A. Mileage Reimbursement/Parking. The mileage reimbursement will be paid to the driver at the 11 District per mile rate. Mileage reimbursement will be calculated by the most direct route to and 12 from the destination. Those drivers pooling with two (2) or more delegates or alternates shall 13 receive an additional ten (10) cents per mile. Parking costs shall be reimbursed after an 14 acceptable receipt is received. 15 B. Rooms. The Board shall select the appropriate accommodations for the delegates and 16 alternates. Delegates and alternates are expected to share rooms when possible. 17 C. Registration. The Chapter will pay the registration fee of the delegates and alternates. 18 D. Meal Reimbursement. Meals not included in the registration fee that are reimbursed will be 19 determined each year based on the meals and incidentals expense chart on the GSA website 20 which includes tip and tax, minus the incidental's column based on the area, after an acceptable 21 receipt is received. No alcoholic beverages will be reimbursed. 22 E. Chapter Gifts, Emergency Relief Fund, Convention Supplies, and Betty Rankin Sponsorship. 23 The funding amounts for the chapter gift, donation to the Emergency Relief Fund, 24 miscellaneous convention supplies (e.g. shirts, buttons, hats, etc.) and donations to the Betty 25 Rankin Sponsorship fund shall be determined in the annual budget. 26 F. Reimbursement. All paperwork needed to get a reimbursement needs to be submitted to the 27 treasurer no later than thirty (30) calendar days after any event or there will be no 28 reimbursement. Decisions for exceptions to the above timeline will be made by the full board. 29 30 Section 8.3.1 Legislative Conference. 31 Any member may attend the Conference when pre-registered through our Chapter. Registration 32 will be completed by the Secretary/Treasurer, as approved by the Board of Trustees. 33 34 A. Mileage Reimbursement/Parking. The mileage reimbursement will be paid to the driver 35 at the District per mile rate. Mileage reimbursement will be calculated by the most 36 direct route to and from the destination. Those drivers pooling with two (2) or more 37 attendees shall receive an additional ten (10) cents per mile. Parking costs shall be 38 reimbursed after an acceptable receipt is received. Attendees will use the charter bus 39 when provided by the State office. 40 B. Rooms. The Board shall select the appropriate accommodations for the delegates. 41 Delegates are expected to share rooms when possible. Rooms will be for one (1) night, 42 not to exceed two (2) nights unless preapproved by Executive Committee. 43 C. <u>Registration</u>. The Chapter will pay the registration fee of those attending Legislative 44 Conference. In the event a delegate is unable to attend the Conference, notice must be 45 given to the Chapter President seventy-two (72) hours prior to the start of the 46 Conference. 47

D. Meal Reimbursement. Meals not included in the registration fee that are reimbursed will
be determined each year based on the meals and incidentals expense chart on the GSA
website which includes tip and tax, minus the incidentals column based on the area,
after an acceptable receipt is received. No alcoholic beverages will be reimbursed.
E. <u>Chapter Gift for Auction</u> . This association will determine through the annual budgeting
process the amount to pay per chapter gift to Auction.
Section 8.4. Audit Committee.
An Audit Committee shall be selected by the Board of Trustees to audit the financial records of the
Chapter.
Section 8.5. Other Or Special Committees.
The Board of Trustees shall designate such special committees as they determine necessary in the
carrying out of the objectives and purposes of this Chapter.
ARTICLE IX
AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of the Board of Trustees at any Board of Trustees
meeting.
