Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, any person, without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, sex, or political belief, shall be eligible for membership.

21 Section 1.1.1. Active Member.

Any classified school employee who is regularly employed by or for the Federal Way School District, and who is a member of Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948, is eligible for membership in this Chapter. A classified employee is one whose position does not require a teaching certificate.

27 Section 1.1.2. Member In Good Standing.

To be eligible to vote and to hold office, a member must be in good standing. To be in good standing, the member shall be employed and current in payment of dues as are required by these Bylaws. Any member who is on authorized leave of absence pursuant to the Collective Bargaining Agreement, shall retain the right to vote and hold office. Any member who is terminated from employment shall not be eligible to vote or hold office.

ARTICLE II

DUES

40 Section 2.1. State Dues.

41 State dues shall be paid monthly to the State Office of PSE as outlined in the State Bylaws.

Section 2.1.1. Chapter Rebates.

- 44 Dues rebates from the State organization shall be received by the Chapter in accordance with the 45 provisions of the State Bylaws.

Section 2.2. Local Dues. 1

- Local membership dues shall be \$0.75 per month. Local dues shall be paid monthly to the Chapter 2
- Treasurer by the School District. Any member who is on an authorized leave of absence pursuant to the 3
- Collective Bargaining Agreement may have local dues collection suspended upon approval by the 4
- Chapter Board of Trustees. 5

Section 2.3. Refunds. 7

Membership dues are not refundable except where an error resulting in an overpayment exists. 8

GOVERNANCE AND OPERATIONS

ARTICLE III

Section 3.1. 16

PSE shall be governed by a representative form of government. 17

18 Section 3.2. 19

Members shall suffer no impairment of freedom of speech concerning the operations of this 20

organization. Active discussions of organization affairs shall be encouraged and protected within this 21

- organization. 22
- 23

Section 3.3. 24

Members shall have the right to a full and clear accounting of all organizational funds. At all levels such 25 accounting shall include, but not be limited to, periodical reports to the membership by appropriate fiscal 26 officers or by independent auditors not otherwise connected with the organization, and a financial audit 27 report prepared by a Chapter audit committee annually, to be presented at the second Chapter meeting of 28

the school year, but not later than December 31st. The Treasurer shall give an oral report monthly at 29

Chapter and/or Board meetings. 30

31 Section 3.4. 32

Members shall have the right to full participation, through discussion and vote, in the decision making 33 processes of the organization and to pertinent information needed for the exercises of this right. 34

35 Section 3.5. Governing Body. 36

37

Section 3.5.1. Board of Trustees.

38 Except when general meetings of the Chapter are in session, the business and property of this 39 Chapter shall be managed by a Board of Trustees. The authority to govern and act on behalf of 40 the membership is vested in the elected Board of Trustees who shall decide all matters affecting 41 the purposes, aims and means of accomplishing the purposes of this Chapter, not specifically 42 provided for in these Bylaws or by action of the members at a regular or special meeting. 43

44 Section 3.5.2. PSE Field Staff. 45

PSE Field Staff shall work closely with the Chapter in an advisory position. All decisions 46 governing the business of the local Chapter shall be the sole responsibility of the elected officials 47 and membership of the Chapter. 48



1 Section 3.6. Operating Principles. 2 In order to provide the Chapter with the highest quality direction and management possible, the 3 following operating principles shall guide the Board of Trustees. 4 5 Section 3.6.1. Board/Membership Relationships. 6 A positive, constructive, cooperative relationship between the Board of Trustees and the 7 membership is essential to achieving the mission and vision of the organization. Therefore, the 8 Board and membership will conduct themselves in a way that promotes mutual trust, 9 demonstrates respect for individual dignity, and displays professionalism. The Board shall 10 utilize positive conflict resolution methods and maintain open, honest lines of communication 11 that respect an appropriate chain of command within the Chapter. 12 13 Section 3.6.2. Media. 14 The President, or his/her designee, is the primary spokesperson for the Chapter. Media inquiries 15 to individual Board members about matters of Chapter concern should be referred to the Chapter 16 President. Inquiries about the position of PSE on any matter of statewide concern or specific 17 legislation should be referred to the Executive Director at State headquarters. 18 19 20 21 **ARTICLE IV** 22 23 **MEETINGS** 24 25

26 Section 4.1. General Membership Meetings.

General membership meetings of this Chapter shall be held at least four (4) times annually at a time and place to be fixed by the membership or the Board of Trustees.

Special meetings may be called by the President, the Board of Trustees, or by petition filed with the President and signed by twenty percent (20%) of the members in good standing of this Chapter.

3334 Section 4.3.

The President shall provide at least ten (10) calendar days' notification to all members of any meeting called. However, said ten (10) days' notice may be waived by the Board of Trustees provided that every reasonable effort is employed to notify the membership of the meeting.

At any meeting of the membership of this Chapter, each member in good standing present shall be entitled to one (1) vote. A member must be present to vote - no proxy vote will be allowed. A minimum of twenty-one (21) members must be present to constitute a quorum before any Chapter business may be

45 Section 4.5. Board of Trustee Meetings.

⁴⁶ Meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be called at the discretion of the President. Meetings may also

- be called upon motion of a majority of the members of the Board of Trustees to the President. A
- majority of the members (50% plus one) of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum.

- The latest edition of <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u> shall be a reference guide on conducting business at meetings; provided, that they shall be superseded by the Bylaws and special rules of this Chapter or of

6 7 <u>Section 4.7.</u>

- 8 Classified Representatives may call Unit Meetings as needed, to be attended by the union members of
- 9 their classified group. These meetings are intended for the disbursement of union information and the
- 10 gathering of opinions from the members regarding issues pertaining to their classification. Any vote
- 11 taken during a Unit Meeting is not binding on the Board of Trustees.

13 Section 4.8.

- 14 To balance representation at LMM (Labor Management Meetings), Union attendance shall include the
- 15 President and/or the Vice President, and at least one member from each of the Nutrition Services,
- 16 Paraeducators and Transportation classifications. One of these members from each classification must
- also be a member of the Board. The Union shall be represented by no fewer than 3 (three) and no more
- than 5 (five) Union members, exclusive of the President and/or Vice President. Guest speakers may be
- ¹⁹ invited to speak about union related concerns. Guests shall address specific topics as needed and shall be
- 20 invited at the discretion of the President.

Section 5.1.

29 The Executive Board shall be composed of:

45 Altogether, the Executive Board and the Trustees comprise the Board of Trustees.



- The Executive Board shall be entrusted with decisions regarding the scheduling of Board and General 1 Membership meetings, agenda items pertaining to those meetings, and emergency spending from 2 specific budget line items: The Sunshine Fund; the Recognition (Retirement) Tea; Annual Executive 3 Board Dinner; Office Supplies; and Miscellaneous Expenses. At least three (3) of the five (5) members 4 must agree to constitute a quorum. These decisions may be communicated through text or email. The 5 resulting decisions shall be shared with the entire Board of Trustees upon agreement. 6 7 Upon Vacancy of two (2) or more members of the Executive Board, the President shall contact the 8 Board of Trustees to vote. A member may only fill one (1) position at a time on the Board of Trustees. 9 10 Section 5.2. 11 The term of office shall be for two (2) years or until their successors are elected. 12 13 Section 5.2.1. 14 The President, Treasurer, Membership Officer, and Position I Unit Representatives (all 15 classifications) and Position 3 Para Unit Representative shall be elected in odd-numbered years. 16 17 **Section 5.2.2.** 18 The Vice President, Secretary, Legislative Rep, Position II Unit Representatives (all 19 classifications) and Position 4 Para Unit Representative shall be elected in even-numbered years. 20 21 Section 5.3. 22 The Board of Trustees shall hold regular meetings, and such special meetings as the President or the 23 Board shall deem necessary for the competent management of affairs of the Chapter. 24 25 Section 5.4. 26 Each member of the Board of Trustees shall possess one (1) vote in matters before the Board. All voting 27 at meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be by each member present in person, and voting by proxy 28 shall not be allowed. A majority of the currently elected members of the Board of Trustees (50% plus 29 one) shall constitute a quorum. 30 31 Section 5.5. Duties. 32 33 Section 5.5.1. President. 34 The President shall preside at all meetings of the Chapter and of the Board of Trustees. 35 36 The President shall be made aware of and supervise all activities of the Chapter; execute all 37 instruments in its behalf, and work with PSE Field Staff, with the advice and consent of the 38 Board of Trustees, to achieve the mission, vision, goals, and objectives of the Chapter. 39 40 The President shall appoint all special committees not otherwise provided for in the Bylaws of 41 the Chapter, subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees, and serve as an ex-officio 42 member of all committees. 43 44 The President, or his/her designee, shall be the spokesperson for the Federal Way PSE. 45 46
 - The President shall report periodically to the membership regarding the progress and standing of the Chapter in regard to the President's official acts; and perform all other duties of the office.

The Vice President shall provide such assistance to the President as requested; serve as 2 Chairperson of the Grievance Committee; shall, in the absence of the President, perform duties of 3 that office; and in the case of permanent disability or resignation of the President, shall succeed to 4 that office for the unexpired portion of the current term of office. The office of Vice President 5 may be shared by two (2) elected members, provided those members run for office as a team and 6 are elected as a team; and that these candidate teams provide the President and Board of Trustees 7 an acceptable plan for the division of their duties prior to the election. They shall share one (1) 8 vote between them on all Board-related issues, and that vote must be cast by the co-vice president 9 who is present at the meeting. Each shall have one (1) vote on broad PSE issues, such as 10 elections and contract approval. 11

Section 5.5.3. Secretary.

13 The Secretary shall ensure that the minutes of general membership meetings and Board of 14 Trustee meetings are duly recorded. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep all records of the 15 Chapter, the Board of Trustees, and to perform such other official functions as the President and 16 Board of Trustees may direct, including the signing of checks. The office of Secretary may be 17 shared by two (2) elected members, provided those members run for office as a team and are 18 elected as a team; and that these candidate teams provide the President and Board of Trustees 19 an acceptable plan for the division of their duties prior to the election. They shall share one (1) 20 vote between them on all Board-related issues, and that vote must be cast by the co-secretary who is present at the meeting. Each shall have one (1) vote on broad FWPSE issues, such as 22 elections and contract approval.

Section 5.5.4. Treasurer.

25 The Treasurer shall receive and be accountable for all funds and monies belonging to the 26 Chapter; pay all obligations incurred by the Chapter as authorized by the Board of Trustees, 27 maintain and inform the Chapter of approved allocations withing the budget; keep an accurate 28 record of receipts and disbursements; and maintain bank accounts and depositories designated by 29 the Board of Trustees. Such money shall be withdrawn by Debit card or checks signed by the 30 President and/or Vice President and/or Secretary and/or the Treasurer with two (2) signatures 31 required. The Treasurer shall render monthly oral financial reports at the Board and/or Chapter 32 meetings as required by the Board of Trustees, the membership, or Public School Employees of 33 Washington/SEIU Local 1948 to ensure that the Chapter is in compliance with all laws and 34 regulations required by the Internal Revenue Service and the Department of Labor. The fiscal 35 year for all financial reports shall be from September 1 to August 31 of the following year, 36 inclusive. The Treasurer shall act as custodian of all properties of the Chapter. 37

Section 5.5.5. Classification Representative. 39

A Classification Rep shall represent the classification of employees which elected them and 40 express to the Board of Trustees the needs, desires, and concerns of the members in their 41 classification. They shall serve as members of the Grievance Committee and may advise 42 members of their contractual rights. After communication with and direction from the Vice 43 President/Grievance Chair, Classification Representatives may facilitate grievance procedures. 44 Candidates for this office must be members in good standing for at least one (1) year, can be full-45 or part-time employees in their departments, and may continue their duties as representatives if 46 they change posts, provided they remain employed in the classification they represent. Classified 47 representatives shall keep the Chapter President apprised of ongoing issues and urgent concerns. 48
