## CHAPTER BYLAWS

# FINLEY

**Public School Employees Of Washington** 

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A. NAME

The name of this Chapter shall be Public School Employees of Finley and shall be an affiliate of Public School Employees of Washington (PSE), a not-for-profit 501(c)5 labor organization operating under the laws of the State of Washington. This organization was chartered by Public School Employees of Washington on December 13, 1976.

PREAMBLE

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#### B. MISSION - OUR PURPOSE FOR EXISTING

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It is the mission of Public School Employees of Finley to work closely with Public School Employees of Washington to support the membership through collective bargaining and the protection of those rights, promote educational enrichment opportunities, encourage membership growth, and provide quality leadership while working closely with the state legislature in an effort to enact laws which will represent the best interest of all classified school employees in the state of Washington.

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#### C. <u>VISION - WHAT WE STRIVE TO ACHIEVE</u>

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We will provide service of superior quality and value that best meets the needs of our chapter members. We will achieve that purpose through an organization and working environment which attracts the finest people, fully develops and challenges individual talents, encourages our free and spirited collaboration to drive the organization ahead, and maintains PSE's historic principles of integrity and commitment to do the right thing.

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D. Through the successful pursuit of our commitment, we expect our services, programs, and activities to achieve a leadership position in representing all classified employees. As a result, PSE, our members, PSE employees, the school district in which we work, and the community in which we live will grow and prosper.

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To promote and provide systematic and effective employee management through collective bargaining; to confer and negotiate in good faith, with respect to grievance procedures and collective negotiations on personnel matters, including wages, hours and working conditions, vacations, holidays and other conditions of employment for the classified employees of Finley School District.

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Both as members and as citizens, we shall also employ available legislative and political action to establish adequate financial provisions for the improvement of public school education and equitable consideration for the classified school employees from the State Legislators.

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PERFORMANCE, AND CONDUCT

ARTICLE I
MEMBERSHIP  Section 1.1. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, any person, without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, sex, or political belief, shall be eligible for membership.  Section 1.1.1. Active Member. Any classified school employee who is regularly employed by or for the Finley School District, and who is a member of Public School Employees of Washington, is
eligible for membership in this Chapter. A classified employee is one whose position does not require a teaching certificate.

E. VALUES - THAT WHICH GUIDES OUR DECISIONS,



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<u>Section 1.1.2.</u> <u>Member In Good Standing.</u> To be eligible to vote and to hold office, a member must be in good standing. To be in good standing, the member shall be employed and current in payment of dues as are required by these Bylaws. Any member, who is on authorized leave of absence pursuant to the Collective Bargaining Agreement, shall retain the right to vote and hold office. Any member who is terminated from employment shall not be eligible to vote or hold office.

#### ARTICLE II

#### **DUES**

<u>Section 2.1.</u> <u>State Dues.</u> State dues shall be paid monthly to the State Office of PSE as outlined in the State Bylaws.

<u>Section 2.1.1.</u> <u>Chapter Rebates.</u> Dues rebates from the state organization shall be received by the Chapter in accordance with the provisions of the State Bylaws.

<u>Section 2.2.</u> <u>Local Dues.</u> Local membership dues shall be \$4.00 per month, two (\$2.00) dollars to the General Fund and two (\$2.00) to the Scholarship Fund. Local dues shall be paid monthly to the Chapter Treasurer by the School District. Any member who is on an authorized leave of absence pursuant to the Collective Bargaining Agreement, may have local dues collection suspended upon approval by the Chapter Board of Trustees.

<u>Section 2.3.</u> <u>Refunds.</u> Membership dues are not refundable except where an error resulting in an overpayment exists.

#### ARTICLE III

#### **GOVERNANCE AND OPERATIONS**

<u>Section 3.2.</u> Members shall suffer no impairment of freedom of speech concerning the operations of this organization. Active discussions of organization affairs shall be encouraged and protected within this organization.

Section 3.3. Members shall have the right to a full and clear accounting of all organizational funds.

At all levels such accounting shall include, but not be limited to, periodical reports to the membership by appropriate fiscal officers or by independent auditors not otherwise connected with the

organization, and a financial audit at least once a year which is made available to all members.

Section 3.4. Members shall have the right to full participation, through discussion and vote, in the
 decision making processes of the organization and to pertinent information needed for the exercises of
 this right.

#### Section 3.5. GOVERNING BODY.

Section 3.5.1. Board of Trustees. Except when general meetings of the Chapter are in session, the business and property of this Chapter shall be managed by a Board of Trustees. The authority to govern and act on behalf of the membership is vested in the elected Board of Trustees who shall decide all matters affecting the purposes, aims and means of accomplishing the purposes of this Chapter, not specifically provided for in these bylaws or by action of the members at a regular or special meeting.

<u>Section 3.5.2.</u> <u>PSE Field Staff.</u> PSE field staff shall work closely with the Chapter in an advisory position. All decisions governing the business of the local chapter shall be the sole responsibility of the elected officials and membership of the Chapter.

<u>Section 3.6.</u> <u>OPERATING PRINCIPLES.</u> In order to provide the Chapter with the highest quality direction and management possible, the following operating principles shall guide the Board of Trustees.

Section 3.6.1. Board/Membership Relationships. A positive, constructive, cooperative relationship between the Board of Trustees and the membership is essential to achieving the mission and vision of the organization. Therefore, the Board and membership will conduct themselves in a way that promotes mutual trust, demonstrates respect for individual dignity, and displays professionalism. The Board shall utilize positive conflict resolution methods and maintain open, honest lines of communication that respect an appropriate chain of command within the Chapter.

<u>Section 3.6.2.</u> <u>Media.</u> The President, or his/her designee, is the primary spokesperson for the chapter. Media inquiries to individual Board members about matters of Chapter concern should be referred to the Chapter President. Inquiries about a position of PSE on any matter of statewide concern or specific legislation should be referred to the Executive Director at State headquarters.

ARTICLE IV 1 2 **MEETINGS** 3 4 Section 4.1. General membership meetings of this Chapter shall be held at least four (4) times 5 6 annually at a time and place to be fixed by the membership or the Board of Trustees. 7 **Section 4.2.** Special meetings may be called by the President, the Board of Trustees, or by petition 8 filed with the President and signed by twenty percent (20%) of the members in good standing of this 9 Chapter. 10 11 Section 4.3. The President shall provide at least five (5) days notification to all members of any 12 meeting called. However, said five (5) days notice may be waived by the Board of Trustees provided 13 that every reasonable effort is employed to notify the membership of the meeting. 14 15 Section 4.4. At any meeting of the membership of this Chapter, each member in good standing present 16 shall be entitled to one vote. A member must be present to vote -- no proxy vote will be allowed. A 17 quorum shall consist of those members present and voting. All voting shall be by paper ballot. 18 19 **Section 4.5. Board of Trustees Meetings.** Meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be called at the 20 discretion of the President. Meetings may also be called upon motion of a majority of the members of 21 the Board of Trustees to the President. A majority of the members of the Board of Trustees shall 22 23 constitute a quorum. 24 25 Section 4.6. The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern this Chapter in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent 26 with the PSE State Bylaws, these Bylaws and with any special rules of order this Chapter may adopt. 27 28 29 30 ARTICLE V 31 32 **BOARD OF TRUSTEES** 33 34 Section 5.1. The Board of Trustees shall be composed of the President, Vice President, Secretary, 35 Treasurer, and a Shop Steward (herein known as a Trustee) elected by the unit from each classification 36 of employees of the School District if represented by the local Public School Employees organization. 37 38 **Section 5.2.** The term of office shall be for a period of one (1) year, or until their successor is elected. 39 40 Section 5.3. The Board of Trustees shall hold regular meetings, and such special meetings as the 41 President or the Board shall deem necessary for the competent management of affairs of the Chapter. 42 43 44 45



<u>Section 5.4.</u> Each member of the Board of Trustees shall possess one (1) vote in matters coming before the Board. All voting at meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be by each member present in person, and voting by proxy shall not be allowed. A majority of the members of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum.

#### Section 5.5. Duties.

Section 5.5.1. President. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Chapter and of the Board of Trustees. The President shall be made aware of, and supervise all activities of the Chapter; execute all instruments in its behalf; and work with PSE field staff, with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees, to achieve the mission, vision, goals, and objectives of the Chapter. The President shall appoint all special committees not otherwise provided for in the Bylaws of the Chapter, subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees, and serve as an ex-officio member of all committees. The President shall report periodically to the membership regarding the progress and standing of the Chapter in regard to the President's official acts; and perform all other duties of the office. Upon being elected the Chapter President, the President's union dues shall be reimbursed quarterly.

<u>Section 5.5.2.</u> <u>Vice President.</u> The Vice President shall provide such assistance to the President as requested; shall, in the absence of the President, perform duties of that office; and in the case of permanent disability or resignation of the President, shall succeed to that office for the unexpired portion of the current term of office.

<u>Section 5.5.3.</u> <u>Secretary.</u> The Secretary shall ensure that the minutes of general membership meetings and Board of Trustee meetings are duly recorded. It shall be the duty of the secretary to keep all records of the Chapter, the Board of Trustees, and to perform such other official functions as the President and Board of Trustees may direct.

Section 5.5.4. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall receive and be accountable for all funds and monies belonging to the Chapter; pay all obligations incurred by the Chapter as authorized by the Board of Trustees; keep an accurate record of receipts and disbursements; and maintain bank accounts and depositories designated by the Board of Trustees. Such money shall be withdrawn only by checks signed by the President and/or Vice President and the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall render periodical financial reports as required by the Board of Trustees, the membership, or Public School Employees of Washington to ensure that the Chapter is in compliance with all laws and regulations required by the Internal Revenue Service and the Department of Labor. The fiscal year for all financial reports shall be from September 1 to August 31 of the following year, inclusive. The Treasurer shall act as custodian of all properties and provide supplies for the sunshine person in each building.

Members shall have the right to a full and clear accounting of all organizational funds. At all levels such accounting shall include but not be limited to, periodical reports to the membership by appropriate fiscal officers or by independent auditors not otherwise connected with the organization, and a financial audit at least once a year which is made available to all members.

Section 5.5.5. Shop Steward. A Shop Steward shall represent the classification of employees which elected them and express to the Board of Trustees the needs, desires, and concerns of the members in their classification. They will be responsible, along with the Grievance Committee, in advising an employee about their contractual rights. All Shop Stewards shall work for no less than one (1) year in classification/position before becoming a Shop Steward for their classification.

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#### ARTICLE VI

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#### ELECTIONS, FILLING OF VACANCIES, AND RECALL PROCEDURES

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**Section 6.1.** Members shall have the right to fair and democratic elections at all levels of the Chapter. This includes five (5) working days notice of nominations and elections, and equal opportunities for competing candidates to state their qualifications and reasons for seeking office to the Chapter membership. Elections shall be conducted by secret written ballot and certified by the Chapter Secretary.

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Section 6.2. Members shall have an equal right to run and hold office, except those persons set forth in RCW 41.56.030 Par. 2, a, b and c ("public employee" means any employee of a public employer except any person (a) elected by popular vote, or (b) appointed to office pursuant to statute, ordinance or resolution for a specified term of office by the executive head or body of the public employer, or (c) whose duties as Deputy, Administrative Assistant or Secretary necessarily imply a confidential relationship to the Executive Head or body of the applicable bargaining unit, or any person elected by popular vote or appointed to office pursuant to statute, or resolution for a specified term of office by the Executive Head or body of the public employer); and those employees classified either by State statute or appropriate State regulatory agencies as being a "supervisory employee."

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Section 6.3. Elections shall be held during the month of May. Terms of office shall be from September 1 through August 31.

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<u>Section 6.4.</u> Nominations may be made by the nominating committee, but whether or not such nominating committee is used, nominations shall be permitted from the floor at the meeting held for the election.

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**Section 6.5.** To be eligible, a member must be in good standing for one (1) year immediately preceding the election.

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Section 6.6. Members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected by secret ballot vote, and the balloting shall be so conducted as to afford all members a reasonable opportunity to vote. At least five (5) working days advance notice shall be given the membership prior to the holding of the election. Postcards with notification will be sent to all members prior to elections.

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Section 6.6.1. All members of the Chapter shall be eligible to vote for the positions of President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. In the election of a Shop Steward, only members in the classification of employees that the Shop Steward will represent shall be allowed to vote.

<u>Section 6.7.</u> Every member of the Board of Trustees shall, upon assuming office, subscribe to the obligations contained in these Bylaws.

Section 6.8. Any member of the Board of Trustees may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the membership at any regular or special meeting of the Chapter. Written notice of the proposed removal must be given to the Board of Trustee member at least five (5) working days prior to the date of the meeting at which the removal is to be voted upon. Such notice must state the cause for the proposed removal.

<u>Section 6.9.</u> Unexcused absences from three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be due cause for removal of the member by the Board of Trustees. Removal of a Board member because of excessive absenteeism shall not require the 2/3 vote of the membership.

<u>Section 6.10.</u> A vacancy in any position, except that of President, shall be filled by the Board of Trustees in accordance with the procedures set forth below:

<u>Section 6.10.1.</u> In the event the president cannot serve the remainder of his/her current term, the Vice President shall serve as president for the completion of the term.

Section 6.10.2. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, all members shall be notified of the vacancy and nominations solicited for the position. Nominations shall be accepted for a period of twenty (20) calendar days following the notification to members. The President, at his/her discretion, may either call a special meeting of the Board of Trustees, or act upon the vacancy at the next regularly scheduled board meeting. Each candidate for the position may submit a letter, or have three (3) minutes to address the board prior to the vote to describe their qualifications and reasons they are seeking the position.

Section 6.10.3. Any other vacancy shall be filled only for the remainder of the term in which the vacancy occurs; provided, however, that when vacancies occur in the office of Shop Steward the President shall direct that a classification meeting be held and that the classification elects a successor for the remainder of the vacant term. Election of the successor must be by majority vote. In the event that more than two candidates run for the office, the candidate with the lowest vote total will be dropped from the ballot after each round of voting until one candidate receives a majority of the votes cast.

ARTICLE VII 1 2 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS** 3 4 Section 7.1. Local chapters shall adopt Bylaws that do not conflict with PSE State Bylaws. State 5 Bylaws shall always supersede local bylaws where conflict exists. 6 7 Section 7.2. This Chapter shall send to the PSE State Office a list of names and addresses of its Board 8 of Trustees and members, together with other information required by PSE and shall notify PSE of all 9 changes in Board members, members, and addresses. 10 11 Section 7.3. This Chapter shall not enter into any collective bargaining agreement, amendment 12 thereto, dispute settlement agreement, grievance settlement agreement, or any other agreement or 13 waiver which affects or pertains to wages, hours or working conditions of the employees in the 14 bargaining unit, nor any agreement which would affect the rights of employees represented by PSE, 15 nor any agreement affecting the scope of any collective bargaining unit, with the District, Employer, or 16 other entity or agent, unless such agreement is first reviewed and approved by the Executive Director 17 of Public School Employees of Washington or his/her designee, provided decisions of the executive 18 19 director may be appealed to the Board of Directors. 20 Section 7.3.1. Original signed copies of all documents pertaining to issues outlined in Section 7.3 21 shall be submitted to the Regional Service Center, who will then forward the original to State 22 Headquarters after appropriate copies have been made. 23 24 25 Section 7.3.2. No contract changes, Letters of Agreement, or Memorandums Of Understanding shall be voted on until there is a reading of such at one (1) union meeting. 26 27 Section 7.3.3. There shall be no contract votes by the union during the summer months until the new 28 President takes office and the general PSE voting body is back to work for the new school year. 29 30 31 32 ARTICLE VIII 33 34 35 **COMMITTEES AND DELEGATES** 36 Section 8.1. Conference Committee. The Conference Committee shall be composed of the President 37 and Vice President. There will be meetings held with the administration as necessary. 38 39 Section 8.2. Grievance Committee. A Grievance Committee shall be composed of the 40 President/Vice President and at least one Shop Steward from each classification of employees in the 41 Chapter and shall be responsible for advising members of their rights as outlined in the State Bylaws, 42 Article XIV, State Grievance Panel. 43 44 45



**Section 8.3. Negotiating Committee.** A Negotiating Committee shall consist of a representative elected from each classification of employees represented by this bargaining unit and shall work with the PSE field representative in developing proposals and negotiating agreements. **Section 8.4. Legislative Person.** The Legislative Person shall work as a liaison between Chapter members and the Zone Representative on the state PSE Legislative Council. The name and address of that person shall be submitted to Public School Employees of Washington, and PSE shall be notified of any changes. 

Section 8.5. Annual Convention Delegates. Delegates shall be elected by secret ballot. Approved expenses (food, gas & lodging) incurred by elected delegates attending the annual convention shall be paid by the Chapter or in accordance with appropriate provisions of PSE State Bylaws.

<u>Section 8.6.</u> <u>Audit Committee.</u> An Audit Committee shall be selected by the Board of Trustees to audit the financial records of the Chapter.

<u>Section 8.7.</u> <u>Other Or Special Committees.</u> The Board of Trustees shall designate such special committees as they determine necessary in the carrying out of the objectives and purposes of this Chapter.

<u>Section 8.8.</u> <u>Nominating Committee.</u> A Nominating Committee may be appointed by the Board of Trustees or elected to make nominations.

Section 8.9. Scholarship Committee. The Scholarship Committee shall consist of five (5) members. One (1) member will act as the chairperson. They will meet to make recommendations for changes and final selection. All changes to the scholarship application shall be voted on by the membership in a general meeting. Any PSE members with children of current senior status shall not be permitted to serve on the Scholarship Committee for that same year.



ARTICLE IX **AMENDMENTS** Section 9.1. These Bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of the membership at any regular or special meeting thereof; providing, that notice of the intent to amend any specific provision be given to the members of the Board of Trustees at least five (5) working days prior to the meeting at which said vote is to be taken.
