2 3 4 5	Employees organize primarily to secure better wages and better working conditions. We hold that they also organize in order to participate in the decisions which affect them at work. One of the fundamental tenets of democratic government is the consent of the governed.
6 7	We are both, employees and citizens.
8 9 10	Collective bargaining is the expression of citizenship in employment. Participation in the political life of the nation, State, local municipalities, and school district is but another of that citizenship.
11 12 13 14	In the same way that we are organized to improve the terms and conditions of employment, we are equally dedicated to exert ourselves, individually and collectively, to fulfill the promise of American life. Amidst unparalleled abundance, there should not be want.
15 16 17 18	We are under a solemn obligation to represent the members of this chapter forcefully and effectively in negotiations with the management of the Freeman School District and to conduct internal organizational affairs according to democratic standards.
19 20 21	THEREFORE, we the classified school employees of Freeman School District, in meeting, adopt these Bylaws this 24 <sup>th</sup> day of October, 1983.

29 30	The name of this chapter shall be the Public School Employees of Freeman School District.

34	AFFILIATION

37	This local chapter shall be affiliated with and be a chapter of the Public School Employees of
38	Washington/SEIU Local 1948. This chapter was chartered by Public School Employees of

47 48	This chapter shall continue until a majority of all of the members vote to dissolve the chapter.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### **OBJECTIVES AND PURPOSES**

The objectives and purposes of this chapter are:

A. To carry out and assist on a local basis the objectives and purposes of the Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948.

- B. To promote the organization of Public School Employees in the Freeman School District.
- C. To promote the welfare of the membership and the classified employees of the Freeman School District, and to provide a voice in the determination of the terms and conditions of employment. We are committed to the process of collective bargaining as a desirable, democratic and effective method to achieve this.
- D. To promote and provide systematic and effective employee management through collective bargaining; to confer and negotiate in good faith, with respect to grievance procedures and collective negotiations on personnel matters, including wages, hours and working conditions, vacations, holidays and other conditions of employment for the classified employees of Freeman School District.
- E. To employ as citizens available legislative and political action to establish adequate financial provisions for the improvement of public school education and equitable consideration for the classified school employees from the State Legislators.
- F. To establish better fellowship and understanding among classified school employees and to strive for their overall betterment through training, legislation and Association benefits.

#### ARTICLE V

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

# Section 5.1. Eligibility.

- A. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, any person without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, sex or political belief, who meets the requirements hereinafter listed shall be eligible for membership.
- B. All persons regularly employed as a classified school employee (as defined by the Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948) by or in Freeman School District, and who are members of the Public School Employees of Washington/SEIU Local 1948, are eligible for membership in the Freeman Chapter of Public School Employees.

A. Application for membership shall be made on a standard PSE application form provided by the Executive Board.

B. Membership dues for the Sunshine Fund, the citizenship award and other Chapter expenses will be deducted in the October paycheck. The amount will be ten (\$10.00) unless otherwise voted upon during the September chapter meeting. The chapter treasurer will invoice the district in September of each year for the employees of record.

Employees hired subsequent to the September invoicing will also pay membership dues. The treasurer will invoice the new employee who will then pay the dues directly to the chapter treasurer.

C. Local membership dues are not refundable except when an error results in overpayment...

### Section 5.3. Rights.

- A. Members shall suffer no impairment of freedom of speech concerning the operations of this chapter. Active discussions of chapter affairs shall be encouraged and protected within this chapter.
- B. Members shall have the right to fair and democratic elections at all levels of the chapter. This includes due notice of nominations and elections, equal opportunities for competing candidates, and proper election procedures which shall be specifically set forth.
- C. Members shall have an equal right to run and hold office, except those persons set forth in RCW 41.56.030; and those employees classified either by State statute or appropriate State regulatory agencies as being a "supervisory employee".
- D. Members shall have the right to a full and clear accounting of all organizational funds. At all levels such accounting shall include, but not be limited to, periodical reports to the membership by appropriate fiscal officers.
- E. Members shall have the right to full participation, through discussion and vote, in the decision making processes of the chapter and to pertinent information needed for the exercises of this right.

#### ARTICLE VI

# **MEETINGS**

# Section 6.1.

General membership meetings of this chapter shall be held at least four (4) times annually at a time and place to be fixed by the membership or the Executive Board. A five (5) workday notice will be given of each meeting.

# Section 6. 2.

- Special meetings may be called by the President, the Executive Board, or by petition filed with the 2
- President and signed by twenty percent (20%) of the members of this chapter. 3

#### Section 6.3. 4

The President shall provide at least five (5) workdays of notification to all members of any meeting 5 called. However, said five (5) workdays notice may be waived by the Executive Board provided that 6 every reasonable effort is employed to notify the membership of the meeting. 7

#### Section 6.4.

At any meeting of the membership of this chapter, each member shall be entitled to one vote. A member must be present to vote – no proxy vote will be allowed. A majority of the members voting at any meeting will constitute a quorum for that meeting to transact chapter business.

### Section 7.5.

37 Each member of the Executive Board shall possess one (1) vote in matters coming before the Board. All voting at meetings of the Executive Board shall be by each member present in person, and voting 38 by proxy shall not be allowed. A majority of the members of the Executive Board shall constitute a 39 quorum. 40

#### Section 7.6.

Any Board Member may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the membership at any regular or special meeting of the membership of the chapter. Notice of the proposed removal of the Board Member must be given to the Board Member five (5) workdays prior to the date of the meeting at which the removal is to be voted upon. Such notice to the Board Member must state the cause for the proposed removal.

# Section 7.7.

- Unexcused absences from meetings of the Executive Board shall be due cause for removal of the
- Board Member by the Executive Board. Removal of a Board Member because of excessive
- absenteeism shall not require a vote of the membership.

Nominations shall be permitted from the floor at the meeting held to elect officers.

#### Section 8.3.

To be eligible for office, including Classification Representative, a member must be in good standing for one year immediately preceding the installations of officers.

#### Section 8.4.

Executive Board Officers shall be elected at the May meeting by secret ballot vote., Balloting shall be conducted to afford all members a reasonable opportunity to vote. At least five (5) workdays notice shall be given to the membership prior to holding the election.

The President and Treasurer will be elected to two (2) year terms of office in odd years. The Vice President and Secretary will be elected to two (2) year terms of office in even years. New officers will take office August 1, following the May election.

#### Section 8.5. Classification Representatives.

Classification representatives shall be elected by the members of each classification. The President of the Chapter shall meet separately with each classification to conduct elections by secret ballot within each unit on or before June 1 of each year. Classification representatives will take office August 1, following the election.

# Section 8.6.

Every officer and classification representative shall, upon assuming office, subscribe to the obligations of an officer and unit representative contained in these Bylaws.

**DUTIES OF OFFICERS** 

# Section 9.1. President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the chapter and of the Executive Board. The President shall supervise all activities of the chapter; execute all instruments in its behalf; counter-sign all checks drawn against the fund of the chapter; appoint the members of all special committees of the chapter subject to the approval of the Executive Board; report periodically to the membership regarding the progress and standing of the chapter in regard to the President's official acts; perform all other duties as prescribed in the Bylaws and perform such other duties usually inherent in such office.

### Section 9.2. Vice President.

The Vice President shall act for the President in the President's absence and perform such other acts as the President or Executive Board may direct. The Vice President may be authorized, by the Executive Board, to act as a co-signer of checks drawn on the funds of the chapter in place of or in addition to either the President or Treasurer. The Vice President shall also serve as the Grievance Officer for the chapter.

### Section 9.3. Secretary.

The Secretary shall ensure that the minutes of general membership meetings and Executive Board meetings are duly recorded and distributed to the membership. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep all records of the chapter, and the Executive Board, and to perform such other acts as the President and Executive Board may direct. The Secretary shall also have the duty of the membership officer to maintain a current and accurate list of members of the chapter in coordination with the membership information section at PSE state headquarters to ensure that all members are paying dues, and will render periodical membership reports as required by Public School Employees of Washington, and to perform such other official functions as the President and Board of Trustees may direct.

#### Section 9.4. Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall receive and be accountable for all funds and monies belonging to the chapter; pay all obligations incurred by the chapter in payment as authorized by the Executive Board; maintain bank accounts and depositories designated by the Executive Board; and such money shall be withdrawn only by checks signed by the President or Vice President and the Treasurer; and at each general membership meeting shall render a financial report as required by the Executive Board; and keep an accurate record of receipts and disbursements; and shall act as custodian of all properties of the chapter. Each September the Treasurer will invoice the district for chapter dues for those members of record. Thereafter, the treasurer will invoice members hired after the district invoicing, the amount of local chapter membership dues as defined in Article V, Section 5.2 (B).

#### Section 9.5. Classification Representative.

The Classification Representative shall be responsible for presenting the views of his/her particular group to the Executive Board. The Classification Representative will arrange meetings to discuss items for negotiation; or any other specific issue that should be presented to his/her classification. When needed the Classification Representative will give input on grievances that affect his/her classification.

No member or group of members or any other person or persons shall have the power to act on behalf of or otherwise bind the chapter except to the extent specifically authorized in writing by the President or Executive Board of the chapter.

The Executive Board shall designate such special committees if they determine necessary in the carrying out of the objectives and purposes of this chapter.

# Section 11.4. Convention and Legislative Conference Delegates.

Convention Delegates shall be elected by majority vote of membership present at the May chapter meeting. Legislative Conference Delegates shall be elected by majority vote of membership present at the December chapter meeting. Voting shall be by secret ballot.

# Section 12.1.
