А.	NAME The name of this chapter shall be Public School Employees of North Kitsap and shall be an affiliate of Public School Employees of Washington (PSE), a not-for-profit 501(c)5 labor organization operating under the laws of the State of Washington.			
B.	MISSION - OUR PURPOSE FOR EXISTING			
	It is the mission of Public School Employees of North Kitsap to work closely with Public School			
	Employees of Washington to support the membership through collective bargaining and the			
	protection of those rights, promote educational enrichment opportunities, encourage membership			

Employees of Washington to support the membership through collective bargaining and the protection of those rights, promote educational enrichment opportunities, encourage membership growth, and provide quality leadership while working closely with the state legislature in an effort to enact laws which will represent the best interest of all classified school employees in the state of Washington.

1	ARTICLE I
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3	MEMBERSHIP
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5	Section 1.1. Active Member.
6	Any classified school employee who is regularly employed (as defined by the Washington State Public
7	Employment Relations Commission) by or for the North Kitsap School District, and who is a member of
8	Public School Employees of Washington, is eligible for membership in this chapter. A classified
9	employee is one whose position does not require a teaching certificate.
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11	Section 1.1.1. Member In Coord Standing. To be aligible to up to and to hold office, a member must be in coord
12	Member In Good Standing. To be eligible to vote and to hold office, a member must be in good standing. To be in good standing, the member shall be employed and current in payment of dues
13	as are required by these bylaws. Any member who is on an authorized leave of absence pursuant
14 15	to the Collective Bargaining Agreement, shall retain the right to vote and hold office. Any
16	member who is terminated from employment shall not be eligible to vote or hold office.
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18	Section 1.1.2. Free-Riders.
19	Any member who opts out of payment of regular dues shall be characterized as a free-rider and
20	shall be entitled only to those rights and privileges as set forth in PSE policy and bylaws. Free-
21	riders shall not be entitled to hold any local or state office, attend local or state meetings, vote for
22	local or state leaders or vote for ratification of collective bargaining agreements. In addition, free-
23	riders may not attend any PSE sponsored functions. PSE dependent scholarships shall be available
24 25	only to dependents of PSE members in good standing.
25 26	Section 1.1.3.
20	The term "member" as used in these bylaws shall be defined as a member in good standing as
28	provided in Article I, herein.
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32	ARTICLE II
33	DUES
34 35	DUES
36	Section 2.1. State Dues.
30 37	State dues shall be paid monthly to the state office of PSE as outlined in the state bylaws.
38	Suite dues shall be paid monally to the state office of 15D as outlined in the state officials.
39	Section 2.1.1.
40	Chapter Rebates. Dues rebates from the state organization shall be received by the chapter in
41	accordance with the provisions of the state bylaws.
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43	Section 2.2. Local Dues.
44	Local dues of five dollars (\$5.00) per member per year will be automatically deducted from each
45	member's February pay check each school year. Any member who is on an authorized leave of absence
46	pursuant to the Collective Bargaining Agreement shall not pay local dues.
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1 Section 2.3. Scholarship.

Two dollars (\$2.00) per member per year from the above local dues (Sec. 2.2) shall be used for
 scholarships only.

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ARTICLE III

MEETINGS

11 Section 3.1.

General membership meetings of this chapter shall be held at least three (3) times annually at a time and place to be fixed by the membership or the Executive Board.

15 Section 3.2.

Special meetings may be called by the President/Co-Presidents, the Executive Board, or by petition filed with the President/Co-Presidents and signed by twenty percent (20%) of the members in good standing of this chapter.

20 Section 3.3.

The President/Co-Presidents shall provide at least five (5) days notification to all members of any meeting called. However, said five (5) days notice may be waived by the Executive Board provided that every reasonable effort is employed to notify the membership of the meeting.

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25 Section 3.4. Voting.

At any general or special meetings of the membership of this chapter, each member in good standing shall be entitled to one (1) vote - no proxy vote will be allowed. Voting by secret paper ballot or electronic vote for all items except for elections of officers and convention delegates. So long as balloting shall be conducted to afford all members a reasonable opportunity to vote. The Secretary shall record the totals for all votes. A minimum of eight (8) members must be present to constitute a quorum before any chapter business may be transacted.

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33 Section 3.5. Executive Board Meetings.

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38 Section 3.6.

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern this chapter in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the PSE state bylaws, these bylaws and with any special rules of order this chapter may adopt.

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ARTICLE IV

EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 4.1. Executive Board. 5

Except when general meetings of the chapter are in session, the business and property of this chapter shall 6 be managed by the Executive Board. The authority to govern and act on behalf of the membership is 7 vested in the elected Executive Board who shall decide all matters affecting the purposes, aims and means 8 of accomplishing the purposes of this chapter, not specifically provided for in these bylaws or by action of 9 the members at a regular or special meeting. 10

Section 4.2. 12

The Executive Board shall be composed of the President or Co-Presidents, as determined by the 13 membership, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Officer, and Building Representatives 14 elected by the unit from each school building and the District Office. 15

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Section 4.3. 17

Each member of the Executive Board shall possess one (1) vote in matters coming before the board. All 18 voting at meetings of the Executive Board shall be by each member present in person and voting by proxy 19 shall not be allowed. A minimum of four (4) members of the Executive Board, including either the 20 President/Co-Presidents or Vice-President must be present to constitute a quorum before any chapter 21 business may be transacted. 22

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Section 4.4. Duties. 24

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Section 4.4.1. President/Co-Presidents.

The President/Co-Presidents shall preside at all meetings of the chapter and of the Executive 27 Board. The President/Co-Presidents shall be made aware of and supervise all activities of the 28 chapter; execute all instruments in its behalf; and work with PSE field staff, with the advice and 29 consent of the Executive Board, to achieve the mission, vision, goals, and objectives of the 30 chapter. The President/Co-Presidents shall appoint all special committees not otherwise provided 31 for in the bylaws of the chapter, subject to the approval of the Executive Board, and serve as 32 ex-officio members of all committees. The President/Co-Presidents shall report periodically to the 33 membership regarding the progress and standing of the chapter in regard to the President/Co-34 Presidents' official acts; and perform all other duties of the office. 35

Section 4.4.2. Vice President.

37 The Vice President shall provide such assistance to the President/Co-Presidents as requested; serve 38 as chairperson of the Grievance Committee and in the case of permanent disability or resignation 39 of the President/Co-Presidents, shall succeed to that office for the unexpired portion of the current 40 term of office. 41

Section 4.4.3. Secretary. 43

The secretary shall ensure that the minutes of general membership meetings and Executive Board 44 meetings are duly recorded. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep all records of the chapter, 45 the Executive Board, and to perform such other official functions as the President/Co-Presidents 46 and Executive Board may direct. 47

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1	Section 4.4.4. Treasurer.
2	The treasurer shall receive and be accountable for all funds and monies belonging to the chapter;
3	pay all obligations incurred by the chapter as authorized by the Executive Board; keep an accurate
4	record of receipts and disbursements; and maintain bank accounts and depositories designated by
5	the Executive Board. Such money shall be withdrawn only by checks co-signed by either the
6	President/Co-Presidents or the Vice-President and the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall render
7	periodical financial reports as required by the Executive Board, the membership, or Public School
8	Employees of Washington to ensure that the chapter is in compliance with all laws and regulations
9	required by the Internal Revenue Service and the Department of Labor. The fiscal year for all
10	financial reports shall be from September 1 to August 31 of the following year, inclusive. The
11	Treasurer shall act as custodian of all properties of the chapter.
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13	Section 4.4.5. Membership Officer.
14	It shall be the duty of the Membership Officer to maintain a current and accurate list of members
15	of the chapter in coordination with the PSE Membership Department and the District Human
16	Resources Department; ensure that all members are paying dues; render periodical membership
17	reports as required by Public School Employees of Washington; and perform such other official
18	functions as the President and Board of Trustees may direct.

20	Section 4.4.6. Building Representative.
21	A Building Representative shall:
22	 Read and become familiar with our union contract and bylaws; De the maximum of communication between the entire and encoders in their heilding.
23	• Be the main source of communication between the union and members in their building;
24	• Meet and greet new members, share contact information and union resources;
25	• Be available as a building resource for union issues;
26	• Support members when requested, by witnessing and documenting meetings;
27	• When appropriate, refer members to union President or Field Rep;
28	• Be responsible for choosing and maintaining a place in the building for the Chapter bulletin
29	board, which shall contain a copy of current contract and bylaws, along with posting
30	minutes, news, and meeting agenda; and
31	• Attend membership meetings and meet with the executive board meetings when a meeting

40	Section 5.1.
40 41	Elections shall be held during the Spring. The term of office shall be for a period of two (2) years,
41	effective September 1 through August 31. Every even-numbered year, the President/Co-Presidents and
43	Secretary shall be elected. Every odd-numbered year the Vice-President and Treasurer shall be elected.
44	Building Representatives shall serve a term of a period of two (2) years, effective September 1 through
45	August 31.

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Section 5.2. 1

Nominations may be made by the nominating committee, but whether or not such nominating committee 2

is used, nominations shall be permitted from the floor at the meeting held for the election. 3

Section 5.3. 5

Members of the Executive Board shall be elected by secret ballot vote. The secret ballot shall not be 6

required in the case of uncontested positions. Elections must be by majority vote. In the event that more 7

- than two (2) nominees run for office, the nominee with the lowest vote total will be dropped from the 8
- ballot after each round of voting until one (1) nominee receives a majority of the votes cast. 9
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Section 5.4. 11

To be eligible, a member must be in good standing for one (1) year immediately preceding the election 12 and have attended at least two (2) chapter meetings in the last two (2) consecutive calendar years. 13

Section 5.4.1.

All members of the Chapter shall be eligible to vote for the President/Co-Presidents,

Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Membership Officer. In the election of a Building

- Representative, only members in the building represented shall be allowed to vote, except in the 18
- event of a mid-term vacancy, which shall be appointed by the Executive Board pursuant to Section 19
- 5.7. Also, if the building fails to elect a Building Representative the Executive Board shall appoint 20 the position. 21
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Section 5.5. 23

Any member of the Executive Board may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the 24 membership at any regular or special meeting of the chapter. Written notice of the proposed removal 25 must be given to the Executive Board member at least five (5) working days prior to the date of the 26 meeting at which the removal is to be voted upon. 27

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29 Section 5.6.

In the event the Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Officer cannot serve the remainder of 30 his/her term, the vacancy shall be elected at the next regular or special membership meeting; provided that 31 notice is provided to the membership five (5) working days prior to said meeting. The process stated 32 herein shall be utilized in the event the Vice-President succeeds to the office of President/Co-Presidents in 33 the case of resignation of the President/Co-Presidents. 34

Section 5.7. 36

In the event a Building Representative cannot serve the remainder of his/her term, the vacancy shall be 37 filled by the Executive Board. 38

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COMMITTEES AND DELEGATES

ARTICLE VI

Section 6.1. Grievance Committee. 45

A Grievance Committee shall be composed of the Vice President and at least two (2) other members of 46

the Executive Board appointed by the President/Co-Presidents. 47



Section 6.2. Negotiating Committee. 1

- A Negotiating Committee shall consist of at least three (3) members of the Executive Board appointed by 2
- the President/Co-Presidents. 3
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Section 6.3. Annual Convention Delegates. 5

- Delegates shall be elected by secret ballot. Approved expenses incurred by elected delegates attending the 6
- annual convention shall be paid by the chapter or in accordance with appropriate provisions of PSE State 7
- Bylaws. Any Member in Good Standing requesting to be elected as a delegate for convention must have 8
- attended at a minimum of fifty percent (50%) of the General Membership meetings held within the same 9
- calendar school year as the Annual Convention in which they want to be a delegate. 10
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Section 6.4. Audit Committee. 12

- An Audit Committee shall be selected by the Executive Board to audit the financial records of the chapter. 13
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Section 6.5. Conference Committee. 15

A Conference Committee must include either the President/Co-Presidents or Vice-President and either the 16

- Secretary or Treasurer. To the extent reasonably possible the President/Co-Presidents, Vice-President, 17
- Secretary and Treasurer shall attend conference committee meetings. Other members may attend 18
- conference committee meetings at the discretion of the elected officers. 19

Section 6.6. Other or Special Committees. 21

The Executive Board shall designate such special committees as they determine necessary in the carrying 22 out of the objectives and purposes of this chapter. 23
