1	ARTICLE I
2 3	MEMBERSHIP
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5	Section 1.1.
6 7	Except as otherwise provided in these bylaws, any person, without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, sex, or political belief, shall be eligible for membership.
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9	Section 1.1.1. Active Member.
10	Any classified school employee who is regularly employed by or for the Richland School
11	District, and who is a member of Public School Employees of Washington / SEIU Local 1948,
12 13	is eligible for membership in this Chapter. A classified employee is one whose position does not require a teaching certificate.

15	Section 1.1.2. Member In Good Standing. To be aligible to yets and to hold office, a member must be in good standing. To be in good
16	To be eligible to vote and to hold office, a member must be in good standing. To be in good standing, the member shall be employed and current in payment of dues as are required by these
17 18	bylaws. Any member, who is on authorized leave of absence pursuant to the Collective
18 19	Bargaining Agreement, shall retain the right to vote and hold office. Any member who is
20	terminated from employment shall not be eligible to vote or hold office.

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26	DUES
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28	Section 2.1. State Dues.
29	State dues shall be paid monthly to the state office of PSE as outlined in the state bylaws.
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31	Section 2.1.1. Chapter Rebates.
32	The Chapter in accordance with the provisions of the state bylaws shall receive dues rebates
33	from the state organization.
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35	Section 2.2. <u>Refunds.</u>
36	Membership dues are not refundable except where an error resulting in an overpayment exists.
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1	ARTICLE III
2 3	GOVERNANCE AND OPERATIONS
4 5	Section 3.1. A representative form of government shall govern PSE.

7 8 9 10 11	Section 3.2. Members shall suffer no impairment of freedom of speech concerning the operations of this organization. Active discussions of organization affairs shall be encouraged and protected within this organization.

12 13 14 15 16 17 18	Section 3.3. Members shall have the right to a full and clear accounting of all organizational funds. At all levels such accounting shall include, but not be limited to, periodical reports to the membership by appropriate fiscal officers or by independent auditors not otherwise connected with the organization, and a financial audit at least once a year which is made available to all members.
19 20 21 22	Section 3.4. Members shall have the right to full participation, through discussion and vote, in the decision-making processes of the organization and to pertinent information needed for the exercises of this right.
23	Section 3.5. GOVERNING BODY.
24	
25	Section 3.5.1. Board.
26	Except when general meetings of the Chapter are in session, the Board shall manage the
27	business and property of this Chapter. The authority to govern and act on behalf of the
28	membership is vested in the elected Board who shall decide all matters affecting the purposes,
29	aims and means of accomplishing the purposes of the Chapter, not specifically provided for in
30	these bylaws or by action of the members at a regular or special meeting.
31	Section 2.5.1.1 Executive Decard
32	Section 3.5.1.1. Executive Board. The Executive Board shall consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary,
33 34	Membership Officer and Treasurer. This body will be the core governing body of the
35	Chapter and shall have the same authority to govern and act on behalf of the
36	membership as the elected Board.
37	
38	Section 3.5.2. PSE Field Staff.
39	PSE field staff shall work closely with the Chapter in an advisory position. All decisions
40	governing the business of the local Chapter shall be the sole responsibility of the elected
41	officials and membership of the Chapter.
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43	Section 3.6. OPERATING PRINCIPLES.
44	In order to provide the Chapter with the highest quality direction and management possible, the
45	following operating principles shall guide the Board of Trustees.

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1	Section 3.6.1. Board/Membership Relationships.
2	A positive, constructive, cooperative relationship between the Board of Trustees and the
3	membership is essential to achieving the mission and vision of the organization. Therefore, the
4	board and membership will conduct themselves in a way that promotes mutual trust,
5	demonstrates respect for individual dignity, and displays professionalism. All newly elected
6	officers and trustees will undergo training in grievance procedure and discipline matters. The
7	board shall utilize positive conflict resolution methods and maintain open, honest lines of
8	communication that respect an appropriate chain of command within the Chapter.
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10	Section 3.6.2. Media.
11	The President, or his/her designee, is the primary spokesperson for the Chapter. Media
12	inquiries to individual board members about matters of Chapter concern should be referred to
13	the Chapter President. Inquiries about a position of PSE on any matter of statewide concern or
14	specific legislation should be referred to the executive director at state headquarters.
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18	ARTICLE IV
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20	MEETINGS
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22	Section 4.1.
23	General membership meetings of this Chapter shall be held at least four (4) times annually at a time
24	and place to be fixed by the membership or the Board of Trustees.
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26	Section 4.2.
27	Special meetings may be called by the President, the Board of Trustees, or by petition filed with the
28	President and signed by twenty percent (20%) of the members in good standing of this Chapter.
29	
30	Section 4.3. The President shall provide at least five (5) days notification to all members of any meeting called
31	The President shall provide at least five (5) days notification to all members of any meeting called. However, said five (5) days notice may be waived by the Board of Trustees provided that every
32 33	reasonable effort is employed to notify the membership of the meeting.

35	Section 4.4.
36	At any meeting of the membership of this Chapter, each member in good standing present shall be
37	entitled to one vote. A member must be present to vote no proxy vote will be allowed. A simple
38	majority of those present will constitute a quorum.

40	Section 4.5. Board of Trustees Meetings.
41	Meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be called at the discretion of the President. Meetings may also
42	be called upon motion of a majority of the members of the Board of Trustees to the President. A
43	majority of the members of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum.
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1 Section 4.6.

- 2 The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern this
- ³ Chapter in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the PSE
- 4 state bylaws, these bylaws and with any special rules of order this Chapter may adopt.
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ARTICLE V

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

11 12 Section 5.1.

The Board of Trustees shall be composed of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Membership Officer, Treasurer, and a unit representative (herein known as a trustee) elected by the unit from each classification of employees of the school district if represented by the local Public School Employees organization.

18 Section 5.2.

¹⁹ The Board of Trustees shall hold regular meetings, and such special meetings as the President or the

20 board shall deem necessary for the competent management of affairs of the Chapter.

2122 Section 5.3.

Each member of the Board of Trustees shall possess one (1) vote in matters coming before the board.

All voting at meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be by each member present in person, and voting

by proxy shall not be allowed. A majority of the members of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a
 quorum.

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28 Section 5.4. Duties.

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Section 5.4.1. President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Chapter and of the Board of Trustees. The 31 President shall be made aware of, and supervise all activities of the Chapter; execute all 32 instruments in its behalf; and work with PSE field staff, with the advice and consent of the 33 Board of Trustees, to achieve the mission, vision, goals, and objectives of the Chapter. The 34 President shall appoint all special committees not otherwise provided for in the bylaws of the 35 Chapter, the President may appoint members to fill vacancies on any committee subject to the 36 approval of the Board of Trustees, and serve as an ex-officio member of all committees. The 37 President shall report periodically to the membership regarding the progress and standing of the 38 Chapter in regard to the President's official acts; and performs all other duties of the office. 39

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Section 5.4.2. Vice President.

The Vice President shall provide such assistance to the President as requested. He/she shall serve as chairperson or co-chairperson, with another Executive Board member of the Grievance Committee, and shall, in the absence of the President, perform duties of that office. In the case of permanent disability or resignation of the President, he/she shall succeed to that office for the unexpired portion of the current term of office.

Section 5.4.3. Secretary.

The Secretary shall ensure that the minutes of general membership meetings and Board of Trustee meetings are duly recorded. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep all records of the Chapter, the Board of Trustees, and to perform such other official functions as the President and Board of Trustees may direct.

Section 5.4.4. Membership Officer.

15It shall be the duty of the Membership Officer to maintain a current and accurate list of16members of the Chapter in coordination with the membership information section at PSE state17headquarters; ensure that all members are paying dues; render periodical membership reports as18required by Public School Employees of Washington; and perform such other official functions19as the President and Board of Trustees may direct.

Section 5.4.5. Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall receive and be accountable for all funds and monies belonging to the 22 Chapter; pay all obligations incurred by the Chapter as authorized by the Board of Trustees; 23 keep an accurate record of receipts and disbursements; and maintain bank accounts and 24 depositories designated by the Board of Trustees. Such money shall be withdrawn only by 25 checks signed by the President and/or Vice President and the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall 26 render periodical financial reports as required by the Board of Trustees, the membership, or 27 Public School Employees of Washington to ensure that the Chapter is in compliance with all 28 laws and regulations required by the Internal Revenue Service and the Department of Labor. 29 The fiscal year for all financial reports shall be from September 1 to August 31 of the following 30 year, inclusive. The Treasurer shall act as custodian of all properties of the Chapter. 31

Section 5.4.6. Steward/Site Representative.

A Steward/Site Representative shall represent the classification of employees that elected them and express to the Executive Board and the Board the needs, desires, and concerns of the members in their classification. They will be responsible, along with the Grievance Committee, in advising an employee about their contractual rights. Each Steward/Site Representative shall attend one (1) union governing class per year.

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ARTICLE VI

ELECTIONS, FILLING OF VACANCIES, AND RECALL PROCEDURES

5 Section 6.1.

- ⁶ Members shall have the right to fair and democratic elections at all levels of the Chapter. This includes
- ⁷ ten (10) working days notice of nominations and elections, and equal opportunities for competing
- 8 candidates to state their qualifications and reasons for seeking office to the Chapter membership.
- 9 Nominations shall be accepted for all elected positions between April 1st and April 15th, and then
- ¹⁰ posted on all Union Bulletin Boards by April 16th. If no nominations have been received for any elected
- ¹¹ position, the Board is open to search out nominees until April 30th, and then these nominees are to be
- ¹² posted on all Union Bulletin Boards on May 1st.
- 13 Elections shall be held at the May Chapter Meeting for all members. At this meeting and prior to the
- election process, Nominators will have two (2) minutes to speak as to why they nominated a member
- 15 for an elected position. Nominees will have three (3) minutes to speak on their qualifications and why
- they want to be elected. Elections shall be conducted by secret written ballot and certified by the
- 17 Chapter Secretary.
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19 Section 6.2.

- 20 Members in good standing shall have an equal right to run and hold office, except those persons set
- forth in RCW 41.56.030 Par. 2, a, b and c, and those employees classified either by state statute or appropriate state regulatory agencies as being a "supervisory employee".
- appropriate state regulatory agencies as being a "supervisory employee".

24 Section 6.3.

- Elections shall be held each year during the month of May. Convention delegates will be elected each year. Terms of all other offices shall be two years to take effect June 1. The President, Treasurer and
- 27 Membership Officer will be elected in odd numbered years. The Vice President, Secretary and
- classification Stewards will be elected in even numbered years.

2930 Section 6.4.

- Nominations shall be permitted from the floor at the M ay meeting held for elections.
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33 Section 6.5.

Members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected by secret ballot vote, and the balloting shall be so conducted as to afford all members a reasonable opportunity to vote. At least ten (10) working days advance notice shall be given the membership prior to the holding of the election.

- 38 Section 6.5.1.
- ³⁹ Only members in good standing shall be eligible to vote for the positions of President,
- 40 Vice President, Secretary, Membership Officer, Treasurer and Convention Delegates. In the 41 election of a Trustee (Steward), only members in good standing within the classification of
- 42 employees that the Trustee will represent shall be allowed to vote.

43 44 Section 6.6.

- 45 Every member of the Board of Trustees shall, upon assuming office, subscribe to the obligations
- 46 contained in these bylaws.
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1 Section 6.7.

- 2 Any member of the Board of Trustees may be removed from office by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the
- ³ membership at any regular or special meeting of the Chapter. Written notice of the proposed removal
- ⁴ must be given to the Board of Trustee member at least five (5) working days prior to the date of the
- meeting at which the removal is to be voted upon. Such notice must state the cause for the proposed
 removal.

8 Section 6.8.

- 9 Unexcused absences from three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be due cause
- 10 for removal of the member by the Board of Trustees. Removal of a board member because of
- excessive absenteeism shall not require the 2/3 vote of the membership. Unexcused absences are
- defined as any absence in which the trustee fails to notify any board member of their absence prior to meetings.
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15 Section 6.9.

- ¹⁶ The Board of Trustees in accordance with the procedures set forth below shall fill a vacancy in any
- 17 position, except that of President.
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Section 6.9.1.

In the event the President cannot serve the remainder of his/her current term, the Vice President shall serve as President for the completion of the term.

22 23 Section 6.9.2.

In the event of a vacancy in the office of Vice President, Secretary, Membership Officer, or Treasurer, all members shall be notified of the vacancy and nominations solicited for the position. Nominations shall be accepted for a period of twenty (20) calendar days following the notification to members. The President, at his/her discretion, may either call a special meeting of the Board of Trustees, or act upon the vacancy at the next regularly scheduled board meeting. Each candidate for the position may submit a letter, or have three (3) minutes to address the board prior to the vote to describe their qualifications and reasons they are seeking the position.

Section 6.9.3.

Any other vacancy shall be filled only for the remainder of the term in which the vacancy occurs; provided, however, that when vacancies occur in the office of trustee, the President shall direct that a classification meeting be held and that the classification elect a successor for the remainder of the vacant term. Election of the successor will be by a simple majority of votes cast.

ARTICLE VII

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

44 Section 7.1.

- 45 Local Chapters shall adopt bylaws that do not conflict with PSE state bylaws. State bylaws shall
- ⁴⁶ always supersede local bylaws where conflict exists.



1 Section 7.2.

2 This Chapter shall send to the PSE state office a list of names and addresses of its Board of Trustees

and members, together with other information required by PSE and shall notify PSE of all changes in

4 board members, members, and addresses.5

6 Section 7.3.

This Chapter shall not enter into any collective bargaining agreement, amendment thereto, dispute settlement agreement, grievance settlement agreement, or any other agreement or waiver which affects or pertains to wages, hours or working conditions of the employees in the bargaining unit, nor any agreement which would affect the rights of employees represented by PSE, nor any agreement affecting the scope of any collective bargaining unit, with the District, Employer, or other entity or agent, unless such agreement is first reviewed and approved by the Executive Director of Public School Employees of Washington or his/her designee, provided decisions of the executive director may be appealed to the Board of Directors.

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Section 7.3.1.

Original signed copies of all documents pertaining to issues outlined in Section 7.3 shall be submitted to the regional service center, which will then forward the original to state headquarters after appropriate copies have been made.

ARTICLE VIII

COMMITTEES AND DELEGATES

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27 Section 8.1. Grievance Committee.

A Grievance Committee shall be composed of the Chapter Vice President, their designee as

chairperson and a minimum of three (3) Chapter Stewards and/or Chapter members, each representing

a different classification of employees in the Chapter, but not to exceed a total of five (5)

31 Stewards/Chapter members on the committee. All committee members shall be responsible for

- advising members of their rights as outlined in the State By-laws, Article XIV, State Grievance Panel.

The Chapter Vice-President, working directly with the Chapter member and the PSE Representative,

The Chapter Vice-President, working directly with the Chapter member and the PSE Representa will determine as to how far they will proceed with the member's grievance. If at any step in the

³⁶ grievance process, the Vice-President decides that the grievance will not be taken any further, The

³⁷ Chapter member has the right to request a review by the Grievance Committee, including a personal

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43 Section 8.2. <u>Negotiating Committee and Sub-Committee.</u>

A Negotiating Committee shall consist of the President and one (1) representative elected by each

- classification. This Committee will represent the interests of all classifications and shall work with the
- ⁴⁶ membership and the PSE field representative in developing proposals and negotiating agreements.
