1	PREAMBLE
2 3	Employees organize primarily to secure better wages and better working conditions.
4 5 6	We hold that they also organize in order to participate in the decisions which affect them at work. One of the fundamental tenets of Democratic government is the consent of the governed.
7 8	We are both employees and citizens.
9 10 11	Collective bargaining is the expression of citizenship in employment. Participation in the political life of the nation, State, local municipalities, and school district is but another aspect of that citizenship.
12 13 14 15	In the same way that we are organized to improve the terms and conditions of employment, we are equally dedicated to exert ourselves, individually and collectively, to fulfill the promise of American life. Amidst unparalleled abundance, there should not be want.
16 17 18 19 20	We are under a solemn obligation to represent the members of this organization forcefully and effectively in negotiations with the management of the Snoqualmie Valley School District and to conduct internal organizational affairs according to democratic standards.
20 21 22 23 24	THEREFORE, we, the classified school employees of Snoqualmie Valley School District, in meeting, adopt these Bylaws this 1st day of October, 1981.
25 26	ARTICLE I
27282930	The name of this organization shall be PSE/SEIU Local 1948, Snoqualmie Valley School District.
31 32	ARTICLE II
33 34 35 36 37 38	This local organization shall be affiliated with and be a chapter of the Public School Employees of Washington. This organization was chartered by Public School Employees of Washington on October 1, 1981.
39 40	ARTICLE III
41 42 43 44 45 46	This organization shall continue until a majority of all of the members vote to dissolve the organization.
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ARTICLE IV

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The objectives and purposes of this organization are:

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A. To carry out and assist on a local basis the objectives and purposes of the Public School Employees of Washington.

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B. To promote the organization of Public School Employees in the Snoqualmie Valley School District.

C. To promote the welfare of the membership and the classified employees of the Snoqualmie Valley School District, and to provide a voice in the determination of the terms and conditions of employment. We are committed to the process of collective bargaining as a desirable, democratic and effective method to achieve this.

D. To promote and provide systematic and effective employee management through collective bargaining; to confer and negotiate in good faith, with respect to grievance procedures and collective negotiations on personnel matters, including wages, hours and working conditions, vacations, holidays and other conditions of employment for the classified employees of Snoqualmie Valley School District.

- E. Both as members and as citizens, we shall also employ available legislative and political action to establish adequate financial provisions for the improvement of public school education and equitable consideration for the classified school employees from the State Legislators.
- F. To establish better fellowship and understanding among classified school employees and to strive for their overall betterment through training, legislation and Association benefits.

ARTICLE

MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Eligibility.

Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, any person without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, sex or political belief, who meets the requirements hereinafter listed shall be eligible for membership.

A. All persons regularly employed as a classified school employee (as defined by the Public School Employees of Washington) by or in Snoqualmie Valley School District, and who are members of the Public School Employees of Washington, are eligible for membership in the organization.

Section 2. Dues.

Application for membership shall be made on a standard dues authorization form provided by the membership chair.

Bvlaws PSE/SEIU Local 1948 Snoqualmie Valley School District

Section 2.1. State Dues Amount.

The State membership dues amount shall be determined by all the delegates at the State Convention of Public School Employees of Washington.

Section 2.2. State Dues Collection.

State dues shall be deducted monthly by payroll and remitted monthly to the State Office of PSE as outlined in the PSE State Bylaws.

Section 2.3. Local Dues Amount and Collection.

The local chapter dues of \$12.00 per year shall be deducted annually on the November payroll and remitted to the Snoqualmie Valley PSE Chapter bank account.

Section 2.4. Refund of Dues.

Dues are not refundable except where an error resulting in an over payment exits. Members who feel there has been an error shall provide PSE, in a timely manner, the appropriate pay stubs that show the amounts mistakenly withheld.

Section 2.5. Chapter Rebates.

Dues rebates from PSE shall be received by the chapter in accordance with the provisions of PSE State Bylaws.

Section 3. Rights.

- A. Members shall suffer no impairment of freedom of speech concerning the operations of this organization. Active discussions of organization affairs shall be encouraged and protected within this organization.
- B. Members shall have the right to fair and democratic elections at all levels of the organization. This includes due notice of nominations and elections, equal opportunities for competing candidates, and proper election procedures which shall be specifically set forth.
- C. Members shall have an equal right to run and hold office, except those persons set forth in RCW 41.56.030 Par. 2, a, b and c: and those employees classified either by State statute or appropriate State regulatory agencies as being a "supervisory employee".
- D. Members shall have the right to a full and clear accounting of all organizational funds. At all levels such accounting shall include, but not be limited to, periodical reports to the membership by appropriate fiscal officers or by independent auditors not otherwise connected with the organization, and a financial audit at least once a year which is made available to all members.
- E. Members shall have the right to full participation, through discussion and vote, in the decision making processes of the organization and to pertinent information needed for the exercises of this right.

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1	ARTICLE VI
2 3	MEETINGS
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5 6 7 8	Section 1. General membership meetings of this organization shall be held at least four (4) times annually at a time and place to be fixed by the membership or the Board of Trustees.
9 10 11 12	Section 2. Special meetings may be called by the President(s), the Board of Trustees, or by petition filed with the President(s) and signed by twenty percent (20%) of the members of this organization.
13 14 15 16	Section 3. The President(s) shall provide at least five (5) days notification to all members of any meeting called. However, said five (5) days notice may be waived by the Board of Trustees provided that every reasonable effort is employed to notify the membership of the meeting.
17 18 19 20 21 22	Section 4. At any meeting of the membership of this organization, each member present shall be entitled to one vote. A member must be present to vote - no proxy vote will be allowed. A minimum of ten (10) members must be present to constitute a quorum before any organization business may be transacted. In the event the President(s) are required to break a tie vote, the President(s) shall have only one (1) vote.
23242526	ARTICLE VII
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28	MANAGEMENT
29 30 31 32 33 34	Section 1. The business and property of this organization shall be managed by a Board of Trustees, except when the meetings of the organization are in session. All matters affecting the purposes, aims and means of accomplishing the purposes of this organization, not specifically provided for in these Bylaws or by action of the members at a regular or special meeting shall be decided by the Board of Trustees.
35 36 37 38 39	Section 2. The Board of Trustees shall be composed of the President or Co-Presidents, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and a unit representative elected by the unit from each of the following classifications of employees of the school district if represented by the local Public School Employees organization.
40 41 42 43 44 45 46 47	Classifications: 1. Transportation 2. Food Service 3. Custodial 4. Maintenance 5. Assistants (Paraeducators/Technicians) 6. Other units requesting further affiliation.

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Section 3.

The term of office of the trustees of this organization shall be for a period of one (1) year from the date of election.

Section 4.

The Board of Trustees shall hold regular meetings each month, and such special meetings as the President(s) or the Board shall deem necessary for the competent management of affairs of the organization.

Section 5.

Each member of the Board of Trustees shall possess one (1) vote in matters coming before the Board. All voting at meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be by each member present in person, and voting by proxy shall not be allowed. A majority of the members of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum. In the event the President(s) are required to break a tie vote, the President(s) shall have only one vote.

Section 6.

Any trustee may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the membership at any regular or special meeting of the membership of the organization. Notice of the proposed removal of the trustee must be given to the trustee five (5) days prior to the date of the meeting at which the removal is to be voted upon. Such notice to the trustee must state the cause for the proposed removal.

Section 7.

Unexcused absences from three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board of trustees shall be due cause for removal of the trustee by the Board of Trustees. Removal of a Board member because of excessive absenteeism shall not require the 2/3 vote of membership.

Section 8.

Any vacancies occurring on the Board of Trustees by reason of death, resignation, disqualification to hold office or removal shall be filled by a remaining trustee. In the event that such trustee is an officer, such selection shall be from the membership at large, provided if less than a year remains of the term of office at the time the vacancy occurs, such vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the Board of Trustees, if more than a year remains, then the vacancy will be filled using the electoral process set forth in Article VIII. All other trustees' vacancies shall be filled from the classification of which they are representatives. Such vacancies shall be filled through the electoral process set forth in Article VII, provided the Board of Trustees shall have the authority to appoint an interim trustee until the election has been completed and a new trustee has been elected. (Note: The effective date of this amendment shall be June 2, 2010).

ARTICLE VIII

OFFICERS, NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1.

The officers of this organization shall be a President or Co-Presidents, a Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. All officers shall be elected for a term of two years. The effective date of the term of office shall commence with the completion of the election.

Section 1.1.

Every odd-numbered year, the President and Secretary shall be elected for a two (2) year term. Every even-numbered year, the Vice-President and Treasurer shall be elected for a term of two (2) years.

Section 2.

Nominations may be made by the nominating committee, but whether or not such nominating committee is used, nominations shall be permitted from the floor at the meeting held to elect officers.

Section 3.

To be eligible for office, a member must be in good standing for one year immediately preceding the election, except in the initial election held in this organization, and must qualify under the provisions of Article V, Section 3-C.

Section 4.

Officers shall be elected by secret ballot vote, and the balloting shall be so conducted as to afford all members a reasonable opportunity to vote. At least ten (10) days advance notice shall be given the membership prior to the holding of the election.

Section 5.

Every officer and trustee shall, upon assuming office, subscribe to the obligation of an officer and trustee, contained in these Bylaws.

ARTICLE IX

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. President or Co-Presidents.

The President(s) shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Trustees. The President(s) shall supervise all activities of the organization; execute all instruments in its behalf; countersign all checks drawn against the fund of the organization; appoint all special committees of the organization subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees; report periodically to the membership regarding the progress and standing of the organization in regard to the President's official acts; perform all other duties as prescribed in the Bylaws and perform such other duties usually inherent in such office. The President shall have his/her dues reimbursed annually upon submission of receipts.

Section 2. Vice President.

The Vice President shall act for the President(s) in the President's absence and perform such other acts as the President(s) or Board of Trustees may direct. The Vice President may be authorized, by the Board of Trustees, to act as a co-signer of checks drawn on the funds of the organization in place of or in addition to either the President(s) or Secretary.

Section 3. Secretary.

The Secretary shall ensure that the minutes of general membership meetings and Board of Trustee meetings are duly recorded. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep all records of the organization, the Board of

Trustees, and to perform such other acts as the President(s) and Board of Trustees may direct. All minutes shall be distributed no more than thirty (30) work days or before meeting date.

Section 4. Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall receive and be accountable for all funds and monies belonging to the organization; pay all obligations incurred by the organization in payment as authorized by the Board of Trustees; maintain bank accounts and depositories designated by the Board of Trustees; and such money shall be withdrawn only by checks signed by the President(s) and/or Vice President and the Treasurer; and shall render periodical financial reports as required by the Board of Trustees or by the membership; and keep an accurate record of receipts and disbursements; and shall act as custodian of all properties of the organization.

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This organization shall be at all times subject to the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Public School Employees of Washington.

ARTICLE X

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 2.

Section 1.

Except to the extent specified in the Bylaws, no officer of this organization shall have the power to act as agent for, or otherwise bind this organization in any way whatsoever. No member or group of members or any other person or persons shall have the power to act on behalf of or otherwise bind the organization except to the extent specifically authorized in writing by the President or Board of Trustees of the organization.

Section 3.

The latest edition of <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u> shall be the guide in all cases in which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the Constitution, Bylaws and special rules of this organization or of the Public School Employees of Washington.

Section 4. Scholarships.

There shall be created a dedicated scholarship fund which shall be comprised of voluntary contributions from local dues pursuant Article 5, Section 2. Allocation of available funds shall be equally divided not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per qualifying student, or as may be adjusted by the Board of Trustees. To be a qualified student, the student must be the son, daughter or child of legal guardianship of a PSE/SEIU Local 1948 Snoqualmie Valley Chapter member in good standing, attend an accredited institution of higher education and must have successfully completed the first semester or equivalent of their instructional year. An official college transcript shall be provided to the Chapter Vice-President who shall submit the scholarship petition to the Board of Trustees for validation and approval. The Chapter Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible for issuing the scholarship. Normally, the scholarship will be presented to the qualifying student(s) at a regular membership meeting.

ARTICLE XI COMMITTEES AND DELEGATES Section 1. Grievance Committee. A Grievance Committee shall be composed of the President(s) or Vice President and at least one unit representative from each represented unit of the Chapter. **Section 2. Negotiating Committee.** A Negotiating Committee shall be composed of the President(s) and/or Vice President and at least one unit representative from each represented unit of the Chapter. The Negotiating Committee shall continue its duties after the expiration of its term until either a contract is ratified or the general membership relieves the committee of its duties. Section 3. Audit Committee. An Audit Committee shall be selected by the Board of Trustees. Section 4. Other or Special Committees. The Board of Trustees shall designate such special committees as they determine necessary in the carrying out of the objectives and purposes of this organization. **Section 5. Convention Delegates.** Delegates shall be elected by the membership. Section 6. Nominating Committee. A Nominating Committee may be appointed by the Board of Trustees or elected to make nominations. ///////

ARTICLE XII

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AMENDMENTS

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Section 1.

These Bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of the members at any regular or special membership meeting. Proposed bylaws changes shall be submitted to the Board of Trustees no less than fifteen (15) working days prior to the regular meeting at which the amendment is to be voted on. The membership shall be provided, in writing, a copy of any proposed amendments no less than five (5) working days prior to any meeting where it is to be voted on.

A. A petition, with the proposed bylaws changes, signed by at least ten percent (10%) of the membership, presented to the Board of Trustees, shall direct the board to conduct a general membership meeting for the purpose of voting on proposed changes.

B. More than fifty percent (50%) of those members in attendance must approve the amendments.

C. The amendment shall become effective immediately following its adoption.
